- 2: an extremely outstanding or unusual event, thing, or accomplishment.

How to Define MIRACLE SUNDAY at First St. John Lutheran Church?

First and foremost, Miracle Sunday will be working with God to help us grow spiritually in our appreciation for God's blessings that abound in our own lives and the life and ministry of First St. John Lutheran Church.

Second, Miracle Sunday will give us an opportunity to prayerfully and faithfully consider how the Lord is guiding us to use His blessings to further the future ministries of First St. John Lutheran Church.

Third, Miracle Sunday will provide financial resources to help pay down the expenses incurred in the renovations and roof repair to the Education Building.

Fourth, the results of Miracle Sunday will help us improve the ways in which we live as the Body of Christ to fulfill our mission. Together with God, we can achieve great things.

Finally, Miracle Sunday is a financial campaign during which we will pray, respond, and celebrate what God is doing in our church. It will be completed between now and October 21, when we will be asked to make a one-time contribution based upon what each of us is able to do. No amount is too small, and no amount is too large. Each is acceptable determined by individual ability and decision. Our Miracle is to reach up to \$180,000. All of it will go to reduce the outstanding debt on the Education Building roof repairs. As a faith community we are looking to God to bless this effort abundantly.

Sunday, September 9 will be our Kickoff Sunday. We are extending the summer worship schedule for that day so there will be one worship service at 9:00 a.m. We will share more information about our goals for Miracle Sunday; there will be time for questions and, most importantly, there will be time for prayer. On that day, we also will Rededicate the Education Building and enjoy a light brunch in the revitalized gym.

Sunday, October 21 will be MIRACLE SUNDAY. We will gather at both services anticipating the Miracle that God will accomplish in and through the members and friends of First St. John Lutheran Church. The results will propel us into the future the Lord has planned for us as the Body of Christ in this place and this time.


