ometime ago in the "Peanuts" comic strip as Lucy, Linus, and Charlie Brown looked up to the sky, Lucy said, "You can see lots of things in the clouds." Then turning to her companions, she asked, "What do you see, Linus?"

"Well," he said, "those clouds up there look to me like the map of Belize, the little nation in the Caribbean." Glancing in a different direction he said, "That cloud looks a little like the profile of Thomas Eakins, the famous painter and sculptor. And that cloud formation over there gives me the impression of the stoning of Steven; why, I can see Saul of Tarsus standing to one side."

"Uh huh," gasped Lucy, "That's good. And what do you see, Charlie Brown?"

Clearing his throat, Charlie timidly replies, "Oh, I was going to say I saw a ducky and a horsie, but I've changed my mind."

You may smile at Charlie Brown. Yet in a more profound way, he reminds me of how God surprises us with more than meets the casual observer's eye. Such, I believe, is the process we use to select someone to fill the office of Bishop in our NW Ohio Synod, ELCA. What can seem to be a haphazard and, at times, tedious, hybrid activity akin to an election prayerfully becomes an avenue for the work of the Holy Spirit.

Such was the activity at the NWO Synod Assembly at BGSU on May 19-21. The 490 voting members gathered from 165 ELCA congregations to select a replacement for Pastor Marcus Lohrmann, who is retiring after serving 18 years as Bishop.

I want to share how Pastor Kurt Meyers, communicator for our Toledo Conference, described the event in the latest edition of his "Toledo Conference Call" newsletter: "SILENCE. On the third ballot for bishop, seven candidates were listed. Each one had spoken to the assembly for five minutes. The names appeared on the screen, numbered from 1 to 7. At the signal, assembly members were told to vote using their tiny voting machines. The signal was given that voting was completed. The surprise: On earlier votes for

motions or candidates, the results appeared on the screen instantly-- but not this time. Total silence fell over the room for five minutes.

"I thought of 1 Kings 19: Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake;  $^{12}$  and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence.

"Sheer silence. A holy moment. Then, David Wietelmann, chair of the elections committee, intoned the results. The Holy Spirit had pushed the process one step further. Now there were three nominees. People began to breathe again. This moment of sheer silence happened again following the fourth, which was the electing ballot.

"HEADLIGHTS. When Bishop-Elect and Mrs. Rachel Beaudoin stood before the assembly for the first time immediately following the election announcement, they looked like young deer frozen in place, staring into headlights. Worry not. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give **you** whatever **you** ask him in my name. (John 15:16 NRSV)"

Pastor Beaudoin has served as senior pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church in Stony Ridge since 2004. He was pastor of St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Edon, Ohio from 1996 to 2004. The bishop-elect earned a Bachelor of Arts in History degree from Oakland University in Rochester, Mich., a Master of Divinity degree from Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio, and a Master of Arts in Medieval History degree from the University of Toledo in Toledo, Ohio. Trinity is one of 8 ELCA seminaries.

Pastor Beaudoin will be installed as bishop on Saturday, July 23 at 1 p.m. at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Bowling Green, Ohio.



# FROM THE CHURCH MOUSE (He's back!)

May 15, 2016, our celebration of the DAY OF PENTECOST

"Some people sing "Happy Birthday" to the church on Pentecost, because the first Pentecost was the birth of the church." (from "Never-Ending Story" on the back page of Sunday bulletin on 5-15-16)

Pentecost, followed a week later by Trinity Sunday, is also an important reminder of First St. John's birth. From worshipping in homes, log cabins and barns, we dedicated our first house of worship on the first Sunday after Trinity in 1861. In those days it was customary to mark special occasions by referring to the church calendar rather than a secular one. Today, we prefer the consistency of the secular.

When you leave church, go east to Wheeling Street, turn north on Wheeling, and begin singing "Happy Birthday." Our first church building still remains, immediately on the right in the "unity block."
