After much conversation amongst our church council members, it has been decided to add a 7:45 am traditional worship service on Sunday mornings. So our Sunday schedule will be 7:45, Traditional Worship, 9:00, Sunday School for all, and 10:15, Celebration Worship. The new schedule will begin on October 12<sup>th</sup>.

As articulated by our Worship Committee, the purpose of having the one service was to: 1) To unify us and develop a sense of family and community amongst our diverse Church family; and 2) To fill our Sanctuary—rather than seeing three sparsely-attended worship services, have one service that fills the sanctuary with singing and worship. It was felt, however, that the 7:45 traditional service would meet the needs of many people in our church. So rather than having three services on Sunday morning, there will be two, with Sunday School in between.

We are working on hiring a new youth director and are in the process of interviewing right now. We are also in the process of looking for an associate pastor, but that will probably be a long, long process.

So we need your help, your prayers, and your support. I am so proud of our Council, Worship Committee, and Sunday School Board. We are beginning to realize the potential of what our Church can be. Together, we can change Potential into Reality!

Kroger Gift Cards are available to help raise money for our youth group and Sunday School. You can buy a card for \$5 (it will be worth \$5 to start) and use it to buy groceries and gas at Kroger. When the cash amount is depleted, you can recharge the card (at any cashier) for any amount up to \$500. The store tracks the amount spent by members of First St. John, and when we reach \$5,000, Kroger sends us a 5% rebate for every dollar spent.

The Gordon Foods Fun Funds cards work similarly, with the money rebated to First St. John used to add to the Member Assistance Fund. Pick up a flyer in the lounge or the Narthex, fill out the membership card, and just wait to receive your card in the mail. There is a \$10 coupon you can use, as well. Use your membership card at any Gordon Foods.

# **CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—SEPTEMBER 16, 2008**

President Bill Caldwell brought the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Linda Kusian led the devotions. Roll call was taken. Bernie Erdmann made a motion to approve the June & July minutes as corrected. Linda Kusian seconded the motion – motion carried. President Bill Caldwell reported we had a great Rally Day. Attendance at the first two blended services was 284 and 264. Seventy-six kids attended Sunday School on Rally Day.

The Worship Committee has been working hard to make this blended service acceptable. Bill received calls and letters mostly positive about the blended service. A few complained it was too loud. Torrence Sound is coming out to work on the speakers.

Discussion was made as to whether we should stay with one service or offer a traditional service. In July it was voted to have a blended service for 5 weeks at 10:15 am. Darold Henninger made a motion to have a 7:45 a.m. traditional service starting Oct. 12. Gary Henningsen seconded the motion – motion carried. Starting Oct. 12 we will have a 7:45 a.m. traditional service, 9 a.m. Sunday School and 10:15 a.m. blended service.

Bill Caldwell and Pastor Blohm went to see the Bishop and discussed our services, our attendance, the loss of our youth director and pastor's assistant. Pastor Labuhn and Pastor English will be able to help us until we get another pastor. A lot of churches are looking for a pastor; not that many are available.

**TREASURER'S REPORT** – Gary Henningsen made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as printed. Linda Kusian seconded the motion – motion carried.

BOARD OF EDUCATION – Pam Beavers reported they sent 170 letters inviting children to Sunday School. 76 attended Rally Day. The teachers will make phone calls. They will keep better track of attendance and will possibly give out awards. They will order new material from Augsburg. They're planning a fall festival. They need a leader for the Christmas Program.

**DAYSCHOOL** – Barb Shellhammer reported they have 200 students and everything is going well.

**ELDERS** – Bernie Erdmann asked for a schedule of the new blended service so they know when to ring the bell etc. Bill Caldwell suggested different parts of the service could be explained at the services.

PROPERTY MANAGEMENT – Mike Folk reported toilets were fixed, pews were rebolted, Pastor Blohm's air conditioner was replaced in his office and the Day School painting is finished. New items to do are: front doors are sticking, some pews are sagging, pull down ladder in the Altar Guild Room needs fixing, vines to be removed from the parsonage, and the new flag pole and light need to be installed.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE** – Jim Sommers reported he will need more time next month and will have the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter report.

**YOUTH** – Pastor Blohm and Bill Caldwell will interview 2 people for the youth director's position.

**PASTOR** – Pastor Blohm thanked Bill Caldwell, Pam Beavers, Karen Holmes and Melissa Lang for making Sunday School a success. Diane Habegger will teach the 7<sup>th</sup> grade catechism class. Pastor would like to get Jamie Blazevich to speak to the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades about drugs and alcohol use. Janine Contat and her sister June Might will participate in an Alzheimer's walk on Sunday, Sept. 21.
