FIRST ST. JOHN LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—JANUARY 25, 2009

The meeting took place at President Bill Caldwell's house. Bernie Erdmann opened the meeting with a devotion. Roll call was taken. Minutes were read and approved. Gary Henningsen made a motion to accept and Bernie Erdmann seconded it. Motion passed

Bill had the council introduce themselves and their position on council. Bill will update the council's roster by getting email addresses from each person.

Bill talked about church attendance for the year. Need to bring people to our church. Encourage people to come to church this year. Now with youth director, Mary Darling, we should be able to grow our church. Attendance was down 4% compared to 10% at the same date last year.

Treasurer's Report The church ended up \$10,000 ahead at the end of year. A bequest was added to the reserve account. Everything has been converted electronically to keep track of disbursements and money given for the year. Gary Henningsen motioned to accept the Treasurer's report. Mike Folk seconded. Motion passed.

Property Management Committee will meet before next council meeting to talk about larger items that need to be worked on. Parking lot project is a big one, among others. A new hinge was put on the back door of education building since it wore out. The light in back of the church needs to be taken down and replaced. Boiler was down because it froze. Did get it reset and it worked. Jim and Gary will be working on them this week and they should be up. Have a new type of salt for steps and sidewalk that doesn't track in as much rock salt that causes damage to carpeting.

Finance Committee No report.

Youth 15 youth came to game night last Wednesday evening. The youth need other people to step up to help hang out with kids. Some activities coming up will be Family Movie Night in Feb. and Spaghetti Dinner on Jan 31. Festival of Faith upcoming.

Pastor Christmas services went well. Good attendance in spite of weather. Pastor mentioned creating a closer relationship with the Dayschool.

Board of Education Getting together to look at their program and maybe change a few things.

Old Business Nominate Julie Gallaher to Board of Education. Joanne Henningsen made motion and Mike Folk seconded. Passed. Julie will be taking over for Pam Beavers.

It was discussed at the last meeting about having a babysitter in the nursery during church services. Someone has offered. Before someone can be hired, a work-up of a job description and salary suggestion needs to be put together. Also the work-up needs to address insurance and qualifications that an interested party needs to have for the position. A nursery attendant was described as a need and a way to make parents feel secure in leaving their children in the nursery. This will be brought up at the February council meeting.

Karen Homes made a motion to adjourn. Bernie Erdmann seconded. Motion passed.
