## FIRST ST. JOHN COUNCIL MINUTES—DECEMBER 16, 2008

Vice-President Mike Folk brought the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. Mark Ackerman led the devotions. Roll call was taken. Jim Sommers made a motion to approve the Nov. minutes. Gary Henningsen seconded the motionmotion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT** – Lisa Anderson reported contributions were ahead of expenses in Nov. Our loan balance is at \$51,804. Joanne Henningsen made a motion to accept the treasurer's report. Bernie Erdmann seconded the motionmotion carried.

**BOARD OF EDUCATION –** Pam Beavers reported the Christmas program was going well. They are looking at new material for fall. Melissa Lang suggested we staff the nursery on Sunday mornings with a paid staff person who is trained in first aid and CPR, and who has a background check. Thrivent could possibly pay part of the salary. Vice-President Mike Folk said we will table this discussion until the Jan. meeting. Meanwhile Barb Shellhammer will ask some of her staff if they would be interested in the position.

**ELDERS** – Bernie Erdmann reported they have five weddings to schedule. They also discussed the nursery. Bernie will stay the head of elders next year.

**PROPERTY MANAGEMENT –** Mike Folk reported Campbell spent time working on the boilers. Jim Schumaker and Jim Sommers will be doing more work on them also. Plans are to replace 2-3 boilers in the spring with one larger unit. A cave-in occurred in the back parking lot. Gary Henningsen will fill that in this week. The gym drinking fountains were worked on – the

ladies is fixed, but the men's side needs more attention.

The flag pole was postponed due to weather. The air conditioner was removed from Mary's office. The railing for the back door is complete and installation should take place during Christmas break.

A television will be installed in the nursery during Christmas break.

The hand rail repair in front of Dayschool is on hold.

The eternal candle has a new brass mounting, thanks to Mike Folk.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE** – Jim Sommers said it had been a pleasure being on the finance committee for 6 years, and he will continue working with Lisa.

**YOUTH –** Mary Darling was very pleased with the collection of Christmas items for the two families. They will wrap the gifts on Wed. night and deliver them Sunday. The group went to the Zoo's Christmas lights. Mary plans to take pictures for the web site and overhead screen.
