### FIRST ST. JOHN COUNCIL MINUTES—DECEMBER 8, 2009

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Caldwell. The devotion was given by Mike Winslow. A quorum was not present at this meeting. There could not be any motions or votes.

**Treasurer's Report-** Lisa gave the report. We need to raise about \$47,000 to finish even with our expenses for the year.

**Board of Education Report-**The Christmas program is this Sunday, December 13 during the late service. They are having a luncheon following the service. Desserts and cookies are needed for the luncheon. There have been about 25 people that have responded to attend the luncheon.

**Elder Report**-They have people to work for the Dayschool program on December 9, 10, 11, 15, 16. There is a wedding on the 19<sup>th</sup> that is covered as well.

**Property Management-** Work is continuing in the boiler room. It should be finished within the week.

**Finance Committee-**The budget and voting will take place during the announcements at the late service and at the end of the early service. Since the late service has the program for the children it will be easier to do the business of the church at the beginning.

**Youth Report-**Mary has the students going to Northwood High School to hear a speaker who is a Christian. All of the Christmas ornaments for the family gifts have been taken. Presents will be wrapped by the youth on December 20<sup>th</sup>.

Pastor Report-He will start the Evangelism Team in January. He is looking into using a Diagnostic Consultation Process to help our church. There is a request from the decorating team for a new tree. An announcement will be in the bulletin and envelopes in the pews for people to donate for a new tree. A suggestion was made to try to sell the old tree.

**Old Business-**The call committee has completed a full election sheet for Sunday's election. There are enough to cover those whose terms are over.

**New Business-**A suggestion was brought up to form

a committee to put together a celebration for the church's 150<sup>th</sup> year. A conversation was also started on increasing church attendance. It was suggested to poll the congregation to see if we held a Saturday service if more people would come. The thought was there may be people that could not make Sunday services based on their jobs.

### **ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING MINUTES—DECEMBER 13, 2009**

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Caldwell. He dispensed with the reading of the minutes from the last meeting. He then spoke about the question of having a Saturday night service. He explained that he wanted to know if the people would attend a Saturday night service. He turned over the meeting to the treasurer.

Lisa Anderson then gave her report on the budget. She gave an update on 2009 contributions compared to expenses. She mentioned a gap of about \$45,000 to meet the 2009 budget. She then spoke for the budget for 2010. They have recommended no increases in salaries across the board. Benefits for staff stay the same except for medical with an increase in disability. Budget for gas has come down due to a negotiation with the gas company and the reduction of gas cost. Repairs will be over in 2009 so the increase was put into the 2010 budget due to the parking lot for upkeep. Increase in office expense has gone up with a trade off on another line item. Youth ministries in the past has had a separate account and now they have been merged into the church account. Their activity can still be tracked. Church activity has increased because of pay to visiting minister and outreach to homebound. Additional taxes from land appropriated from the home. The insurance bill is up 25%. A meeting has been set with the agency in 2010. Total budget is \$327,000 for 2010. No questions were asked about the budget.

Bill then thanked the members of council who are leaving this year. He then directed people to look at the ballot to see that there are just enough people to fill the spots for council. He asked for nominations and had none. Then he directed people to fill out their ballot and for people to write any comments on their ballot.

The meeting was suspended till the late service.

At the late service, the meeting was opened by President Bill Caldwell. He again dispensed with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting. He spoke about the idea of a Saturday night service and told people the council wants to know if anyone would attend. The church does not have the resources for this service but will work with the worship committee if there is interest in that.

Bill had the budget and ballot passed out to the congregation. He then introduced Lisa Anderson to speak about the budget. She spoke of the same things in the budget as first service. She then asked if there were any questions on the budget.

Olga Zimmerman thanked the council and finance people for their work.

Bill thanked the people going off council. He then directed the congregation to vote on the budget and for people coming onto the council. Bill spoke of focusing on membership and volunteerism in 2010 in our church. He then thanked the nominating committee for calling members to run for council.

He then adjourned the meeting.
