### NOTICE FROM OUR SYNOD: "Sharing Faith and Serving: Northwestern Ohio Synod Annual Appeal"

FIRST ST. JOHN COUNCIL MINUTES - MARCH 16, 2010

President Bill Caldwell called the meeting to order. Pastor did the devotions. Attendance was taken. A quorum was not present.

Special Report-Bill introduced Tracee Swank, a representative from Church Doctor Ministries. She spoke about who they are and what the ministry does. This ministry makes churches healthy spiritually. They have helped over 1600 churches of many faiths. They partner with churches to help them change whatever needs to be changed in order for the church to grow in faith. Council will take the information she shared with us into consideration and make a recommendation. Bill asked if there were any comments. He feels that we need to have 100% on board if we decide to do this. It was left for council to consider and think about for the next meeting.

**Treasurer's Report-**The report was given by Chris Hunsaker. We are down \$19,000 in the current fund for February due to many bills for snow removal and other winter expenses.

**Board of Education-**The Sunday School Board will consult with Barb Shellhammer from the Dayschool to help influence parents of Dayschool children to bring their children to SS. They have brainstormed many ideas that can be implemented.

**Elders**-All services have been covered to pick up the absences of Linda and Bernie. On April 12 the 8<sup>th</sup> graders will be tested by the Elders for confirmation.

Property Management-No report

**Youth report-** The youth raised \$250 dollars for the Souper Bowl of Caring. Their room is almost finished. They are going to see Toby Mac on Sunday. Movie night will happen at the end of March.

**Dayschool Report**-Barb gave the report on the Dayschool. Spots are quickly filling up for next year's classes. Extended care is lacking mostly because of the economy. She met with women of the church on the kitchen upstairs. They are making some changes to make room for the Dayschool.

**Pastor's Report**-He gave the schedule for Holy Week services. Look in your newsletter for times. Confirmation will be on April 18<sup>th</sup>. Dayschool will sing on the April 25<sup>th</sup> and there will be no communion on that Sunday. May 2 will have communion at both services. Synod assembly will be May 13-15<sup>th</sup> in Bowling Green. Anyone interested in attending should see Pastor. The synod is having an appeal to raise \$500,000 for the different ministries of the Northwest Ohio ELCA. In April there will be an opportunity to give to the appeal.
