As we strive to grow together in Christ and live a Christian life, sometimes it's important to remember that the "small stuff" can really be the "big stuff" in someone else's eyes – and in the Savior's eyes, as well.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES - AUGUST 17, 2010

Bill called the meeting to order. Barb Shellhammer gave the devotion. Attendance was taken and there was not a quorum in attendance.

Approval of minutes were dispensed with.

Special Report- Melissa Lang gave a report on Thrivent Choice Dollars. Monies collected have to go toward helping others or to a church organization. Thrivent is sending letters to churches to explain the program. There was discussion on how to use the money from Thrivent around the church. Thrivent needs advocate members to explain what Thrivent can do for congregations. Voting on a project will take place at the next meeting.

Board of Education-Karen Holmes reported on the Aug. 29 service. Things are in place to handle people and for the order of service. The TV is hooked up downstairs, and Darold and Eric will take care of it. Parking issues have been solved by using the grove and orphanage lots, and the bus will shuttle them. Dayschool scholarships will be given out during this service. Julie Gallaher reported about the Sunday School program for the 2010-2011 year. They are advertising Sunday School to the Dayschool parents. Parents of SS students can stay and chat during the SS hour outside the SS school room in the basement. Melissa brought up the need for a VBS manager for next year. It was suggested to a paid Christian Education position. Bill suggested a staff meeting to talk about the issue.

Elders-The 29th service is covered.

Property Mgmt- The annual fire inspection took place, and the hood over the stove in kitchen needs to be replaced. Quotes are being collected. They are inspecting the hot water situation- hot water coming out instead of cold in some faucets.

Finance-The accounts were explained by the committee. There was a comparison made between July 2009 and July 2010. Last year's July income was down, but it is down even more this year. Giving needs to be maintained to meet expenses and pick up the shortfall we have. A reminder will be put in the bulletin to let the congregation know what is happening with meeting the budget.

Treasurer's Report-No report

Youth -No report

Dayschool-They started extended care today. Parent meetings have begun. Soon there will be 180 in the building. They are going to try more fund raisers this year. Tuition has not been increased this year for any student.

Pastor Report-A reminder to come to the service on the 29th. We want people to see our church as a welcoming place. Please encourage people to come.

Old Business-Bill asked for feedback about the summer service. Bill mentioned the 150 yr. celebration. Committee meets every month. Proceeds from the Pancake Breakfast go to the 150th celebration expenses. One year ago the Board of Ed came to council to ask permission to:

- Create a modern space for our youth group to meet and worship
- Redesign the nursery so it can be used for both a pre school room and a nursery
- Create a new cafeteria space for the Dayschool in the gymnasium that is flexible enough to allow other church activities
- Create a new space in the basement for parents to wait for children in the SS. Includes a place to sit and have coffee and rolls.

Permission was given and after some hard work by a lot of volunteers, the project will be complete for the upcoming JAM sessions beginning this September.

New Business-Pictures will be taken for a new directory. Lynn Folk has connected with the company. The book will be made for free. Only cost is if someone wants to purchase pictures for themselves. Oct 11 and 12, 27, 28, and 29 are the dates for pictures to be taken.

Meeting was brought to an end by praying the Lord's Prayer.
