# CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—OCTOBER 26, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Bill Caldwell. Pastor Blohm led devotions. The roll was taken. Minutes were read from the last meeting. Bill asked for a motion to approve them. Dave Warnke motioned and Mike Winslow seconded it and the motion passed.

Treasurer-For September we had a positive income over expenses. For year to date we are still short \$34,000 to meet the budget. This information was shared with the congregation by Lisa Anderson at both services. We need to raise \$110,000 to meet expenses for the year. We made some progress in October. We have 9 Sundays left before Christmas Eve, and hopefully we will come closer to meeting the budget. Bill asked for a motion to approve the report so Gary Henningsen made the motion and Mike Winslow seconded it and it passed.

**Board of Ed.-**The Christmas program will be a party on Saturday, December 11. The Sunday School has been very busy since the beginning of September and is pleased with attendance and the new Sunday School area.

Finance-The 2011 budget was distributed. Lisa went through each item explaining the changes. Due to the projected deficit this year, salaries were held the same as 2010. The only increases were the cost of benefits next year. This is the second year salaries have been frozen. After discussion with council, Bill asked for a motion to present the budget proposal to our congregation. JoAnne Henningsen motioned and Larry Paul seconded it and it passed.

#### **Elders-**No report

**Property Management-**Kitchen stove has been repaired. A new suppression system will be installed after the chicken and ham dinner. Sign out front and a step in front of the church will be repaired.

**Dayschool-**Barb gave the report. Thanksgiving Feasts will be held November 16, 17, 18 and 19. Help is needed to serve and make some of the food. On December 13, 14, 15, and 16 at 7:00 the Dayschool will have their Christmas programs.

**Youth-**Mary spoke about Trunk or Treat. It was very successful with about 85 kids attending. Sixteen

families were not connected to the church or school. Three families who filled out registrations said they were looking for a church. Twenty-nine families came from the congregation and the school. They will work on project Give a Blessing and will help some families in need over Christmas. This month students will go to Mary's house to play games and have fellowship. The Youth will sell pop at the Chicken and Ham dinner.

Pastor-Pastor had a transfer in, Elaine Gladieux, from First St. Mark and asked for a motion to accept the transfer. Mike Winslow motioned and Bernie Erdmann seconded. Motion passed. Pastor will offer a new members class in January. Pastor went to a meeting with the Bishop, which centered on what God is doing in personal lives and the community. It was encouraging for congregations.

**New Business-**Bill passed out a booklet from the synod that shared stories of faith in action.

A note from Brad Luebcke of the Oregon Career & Tech Center asked to use the gym kitchen for the culinary program. He will pay rent for use of the kitchen. Council is not sure it is feasible with the use the kitchen has now. The logistics of this program coming in was discussed. Hours would be 4-10pm. WELCA is looking for more details. Bill will talk to the WELCA president about the concerns.

**Old Business**-Bill talked about the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary committee. They have ordered little medallions to be sold for \$15 as a memento of the church. They should arrive before Christmas. They have been working on the history of the church.

Lynn Folk reminded everyone to get their pictures taken for the church directory.

Mike Winslow announced there will be a Father/Son banquet on February 16. Mike is looking for a speaker for this event.

Bill asked would be going off council this year. He asked for a nominating committee for 2011. Keith Mullen will lead the committee.

The motion was made to adjourn by Dave Warnke and seconded by Larry Paul. Motion passed. The Lord's Prayer was then recited by the council.
