THE LUTHERANS ARE COMING!!

From Field Mouse to Church Mouse...

As early as 1859 the Iowa Synod pastor from Salem Lutheran church in Toledo had been contacting receptive German immigrant farmers at the edge of the Black Swamp east of the Maumee River. No bridges or roads made much of the area accessible only by a foot path from the river where itinerant boat owners ferried people from Toledo to the east shore of the Maumee.

Picture in your mind if you will — the living and travel issues of the original First St. John families. "By felling the nearest trees, enough room was made to travel, but stumps were not taken out. If you avoided a stump on the left, you had to go over one on the right" (taken from the Rev. Karl Beckel's obituary). Pastor Beckel labored in East Toledo from 1862 until 1894, serving 32 years as pastor of First St. John's Church, Director of the Home for Orphans, and as district president of the Lutheran Church.

In 1865 the first free bridge across the Maumee river was a wooden pedestrian bridge. The first stone road in Oregon was Cedar Point Rd. on or about 1922.

As you and your family and friends gather for the holidays, and if you happen to share trivia, traditions, or pictures about our congregational history, please pass these on to the 150th anniversary committee. What you might consider "trivial" could be of great value when combined with what we already have.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES—NOVEMBER 16, 2010



Bill called the meeting to order. Pastor did the devotion. Attendance was taken and there was not a quorum to be able to vote. Minutes were read and Bill asked if there were any questions.

Finance Report Some requests are coming through from the Lutheran Home Society for Outdoor Ministries

Board of Ed This past Sunday, Sunday School had the highest attendance-- 32 students sang at the late service. Fire extinguishers need to be hung in the SS room. Property Management will hang them. SS board wants to be able to send out a postcard or place an ad in the newspaper for people who haven't been in attendance for awhile. SS wants to attract those people here during the Christmas season. It was agreed to generate a database list and send out a greeting to them. In January they would like to have an open house with a luncheon to show the parents what other areas they could be involved with in the church. For non-member baptisms a welcome bag would be a good way to welcome them and let them know what is offered here. An adult SS would be a good addition for the parents of SS children. Thank you to WELCA for donating the money for the scholarships. There will be a SS Christmas program on December 19 during the late service.

Treasurer Report There were more expenses in October due to lawn care. Year-to-date the net deficit is around \$35,000. The church needs a strong finish to get beyond the deficit. Around \$70,000 needs to come in.

Elder Report They are generating a list of workers for the Dayschool Christmas programs. Torrence Sound may have to be called to check the projector because it has lines on the screen.

Property Mgmt The landing in front of the main church doors has been spread with epoxy to seal cracks and prevent leaks. Fire protection for the kitchen has been started. Jim Sommers will let the church know when the workers will come. A new rack will be built for housing the Christmas tree.

Dayschool Report They had their first feast today serving 200 people. The Dayschool will continue their feasts for the remainder of the week.

Youth Report None

Pastor Report Family Blessing Sunday will be in January. This will be the 2nd year for this.

New Business The council is looking for new people to run for the vacancies that will be available on council.

Old Business A request has come from the Altar Guild for a new faucet for their sink.

The meeting ended and council recited the Lord's Prayer.
