

A Belated Christmas Letter

(A Mouse tail tale from 1860)

During First St. John's 150th anniversary year, we will present articles about the history of our church. However, the story of First St. John will be presented as a tongue-in-cheek historical novel told from the point of view of a cemetery mouse (German word: Maus). The mouse is often used as a term of endearment in German culture. However, our Maus author must remain anonymous! (This month's information came from Waggoner or Killetrs histories of Lucas County, Salem Lutheran Church records, Lutheran Home Society [Pastor Labuhn], Wartburg Seminary, and German Lutheran Missions [Neundettelsau].)

Speculators have acquired large tracts of land and plotted their own villages. Of the many villages, Port Lawrence and Vistula consolidated into the town of Toledo in 1835. The northern border dispute led to the "Toledo War."

A land-rich widow, Elizabeth Flagg, periodically sold land to support herself. She just sold ten acres of land to Johannas Doerfler, born in Deberndorf, Bavaria in Germany. Johannas emigrated in 1854 as the 97th "sendling" of a mission-minded Father Loehe in Neundettelsau, Germany. He became a mission pastor on the Wisconsin frontier for the newly formed Lutheran Iowa Synod.

Last year, 1859, he accepted a call from the theologically troubled Salem congregation in Toledo, Ohio. The theological differences were settled, and Salem became an Iowa Synod congregation.

Some German immigrant farmers on the east side of the Maumee River have befriended Johannas because of their hunger for the "Word." Serving them is a challenge as there are no roads. He has conducted services in barns, granaries, and the abandoned log Congregational church. The church was disbanded when all the male members enlisted in the Army of the North.

Johannas has been working with the widows and orphans in Toledo and has taken some of the most unfortunate into his own home, but he has had a difficult time. Remembering the community plan at Neundettlsau led Johannas to form an Orphan Home Society this past June. They began circulating a statement of purpose and a pledge of money or labor for the construction of their "small house of worship." Ground was broken this past Fall.

Soon after, David got a job closer to home, one that he has been happy with for the last five years.

How many times do we assume that an apparent "no" to our prayers is evidence that God doesn't care about us? Nothing could be further from the truth. In fact, the apostle Paul wrote, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" (Romans 8:28). What we think is good for us may not be good at all, and what appears to be awful at one time can open a door to something better. 

FIRST ST. JOHN COUNCIL MINUTES—DECEMBER 21, 2010

Bill called the meeting to order. Devotions were read by Pastor Blohm. Bill thanked the council for attending tonight's meeting. Bill had council look over last meeting's minutes.

Finance Report Jim added to the treasurer's report by reporting about a letter from the synod about giving to Salem Lutheran Church. So we will put some money aside for them for 2011.

Board of Education They are working on the new member luncheon for January. Christmas program went very well on Sunday.

Elder Report The elders covered the Dayschool programs. Attendance was overwhelming on Tuesday night because of having a large class and also on Wednesday night due to making up for a program that was canceled on Monday. Christmas Eve services are covered. One wedding on the 31st of December is covered as well. Eight weddings are scheduled for 2011 with 4 in October. Bill made a new schedule for the 2011 year and they are short 2 elders, but services will be covered. Bernie will be chairman of the elders for 2011.
