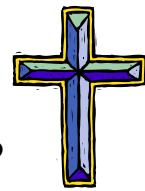

The Way It Was! (From the CHURCH MOUSE)

Now that I am enjoying the comforts of the Church building and have been promoted to CHURCH MOUSE, it is time to reflect and give thanks. While we were excited about our accomplishments, the outside world was changing also. Abraham Lincoln was elected to the office of President of the United States. Secession-minded states renounced their statehood over policy differences and formed the Confederate States of America with Jefferson Davis as provisional President at Montgomery, Alabama in 1861. The nation divided could not stand. A bloody war* that pitted brother against brother and neighbor against neighbor ended in 1865.

The returning soldiers and the expanding economy continued to grow our community. The ever-expanding railroads from the south and east ended on the east side of the river for lack of a bridge. Downtown Toledo business interests were fearful of the competition from the east side. Marine shipping interests were also against a bridge because it would interrupt open navigation on the river. Toledo council passed a resolution indicating it would be “unwise and inexpedient and likely to produce a permanent injury to the commercial advantages of the city” to build a bridge to the east side. The first Cherry Street bridge opened in 1865. After that, industrial development on the east side and railroad developments made annexation of the east side attractive. A resolution of intent was filed in July, 1872, and the annexation of the east side as we know it was finalized on December 30, 1872. The St. John Church and Orphans Home now became part of Toledo, Ohio.

The membership** continued to grow: 1867: 25 voting, 124 Souls. 1869: 36 voting, 160 Souls. 1871: 42 voting, 239 Souls. By 1874: 44 voting, 244 Souls.

The recently expanded 21' x 43' Chapel has reached its capacity! A 100' frontage x 200' depth lot adjacent to the west side of the first acre was donated by the Trustees of the Lutheran Orphan Asylum for \$1.00 on June 17, 1876.

Mr. Th. Becker, a Toledo architect, submitted plans for a 40' x 60' building without a basement but with a steeple and a 100-foot bell tower. Bids were: Becker/ Koch—\$4450.40; H.H. Samson—\$4148.40; and E.H. Kuhlmann—\$3538.00. The contract was awarded to Eberhardt Kuhlmann on May 8, 1876. Mr. Kuhlmann was also a carpenter. While working on the bell tower, he dropped his hammer and it found its way down between the inner and outer walls. (The hammer was not retrieved until the building was torn down in 1928.)

Seaman Street remained a dirt road and would not see improvements until 1916. The original chapel then was designated a Parochial Schoolhouse. The Schoolhouse at the street was moved back to enlarge the parsonage as some students stayed overnight.

We are thankful for our new and improved facilities but there is another event to celebrate: **The United States of America is 100 years old!**

I think I will mouse around Toledo and report back!

PS: We are at a time in history when photography became commonplace for professionals, but it would be another 50 years before the average citizen enjoyed their “Brownie Cameras.” Old photos and documents will be displayed in the west alcove of the Narthex. Check them out before or after services.

Dear Friends and Family of First St. John,

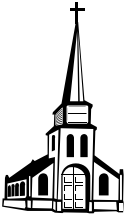

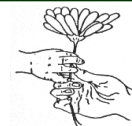

COUNCIL MINUTES—February 15, 2011

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. President Bill Caldwell asked for approval of the minutes for the last 3 months of meetings. Gary DeWitt and Bernie Erdmann made motions to accept the minutes. The motion passed.

Treasurer's Report-Lisa reported we had a shortfall of \$3200 for January. An insurance bill, real estate taxes and snow removal were the large expenses for the month. The second report was the Giving by Fund account which shows specifically where the money goes. Using the new computer program, monies are easily accounted for in the funds. The insurance is being paid quarterly instead of all at once. It was discussed to spread it out at a cost of about \$3.00 per quarter so that a large sum wouldn't be paid all at once. A motion was made by Gary Henningsen and seconded by Larry Paul to accept the treasurer's report, and it passed.

Board of Education-On March 1st the Sunday School board will attend Dayschool open house. On March 6th they will have a family bowling night. They have ordered VBS materials. No date has been set for VBS. There will be a blood drive April 5th. The Red Cross will come to talk to the Dayschool and Sunday School about their parents donating blood. May 22nd will be the end-of-year Dayschool church service for Dayschool and JAM students. They will honor the graduating kindergarten students. An ice cream social will follow. This past Sunday the JAM students hand-delivered valentines to the Lutheran Home Assisted Living.

Dayschool Report-Barb reported they are now enrolling students for next year. Open house is March 1 for anyone who wants to see the school. The school will be celebrating Lutheran Schools Week beginning March 6. The Dayschool will sing in the church on May 1.

Elders-Bernie Erdmann reported another wedding has been added to their schedule. They are still looking for another person to add to their roster.

Property Mgmt- The projector is on its way back to be hung again. A new door was installed at the outside elevator entrance. There is a leak in the

lounge which has now dried out. Snow was melting and running down the elevator shaft. It will be taken care of.

Finance-Jim Sommers reported they have moved to electronic banking by getting statements online. It was announced that Fred Saelzler passed away today. Bill spoke briefly about how Fred was very good at the treasurer's job. Fred put the special funds accounts together in 1983, which created accounts the congregation uses to support special needs in the church. He will be greatly missed.

Synod meeting is May 20-21. Barb will teach Catechism for the 7th grade until the end of the catechism year. Gary DeWitt and Gary Henningsen motioned to accept the new members, and it passed. Lent begins on March 9.
