Oswald Chambers, the great messenger of God, wrote often about the difference between *happiness* and *joy*. Chambers once wrote, "The Bible talks plentifully about joy, but it nowhere speaks about a 'happy' Christian. Happiness depends on what happens, joy does not. The stronghold of the Christian faith is the joy of God, not my joy in God! Remember Jesus' prayer, 'that my joy may be in you . . .""

The Joyful Noiseletter (it gets its title from Psalm 98:4) told about a "Resurrection Sunday Dance" performed by over 1,500 young Christian men and women in the city square of Budapest, Hungary. The dancing and singing, all beautifully choreographed (and joined in by many older folk), is captured in a You Tube video, sponsored by Faith Church in Budapest. Some of the lyrics are:

A light dawned that Sunday morning
It broke through the boundaries of time
That day will be remembered as the greatest
day in history!
Joy in this lifetime, utterly free.
Let's celebrate eternal life.

And that's a great idea! If you don't have access to a computer, go to the library and go to You Tube and type in "Resurrection Sunday Dance 2010." The joy in that video is contagious!

Then come to God's House – and join in the celebration of eternal life!

The United States is 100 Years Old!

(From the Church Mouse)

While we were celebrating our new 1876 church building, the nation was celebrating the Centennial of the United States. I promised to "mouse" around Toledo and report.

WOW! What a celebration. The outlook in the morning of July 4th was discouraging. Rain threatened to spoil everything, but providence smiled at last! The four-mile-long parade displayed all the interests of the city. Eloquent speeches followed at the exhibition grounds on the river at the foot of Stickney Ave. Some 15,000 people packed the river bank as well as in boats of all descriptions. The fireworks were superb under a full moon. The Toledo Blade on the 5th of July summarized the event with: "Let us hope that every other city had as glorious a Centennial as ours. And that we may all meet at the next one."

Previously, the mouse had stated that the cost of the 12 foot extension on the Chapel was unknown. We have found another box of old receipts and now have more information. The extension apparently was accomplished as funds were available. Timbers and framing lumber were purchased in the summer of 1867. Interior finishing materials were purchased in the spring of 1868. The project lasted a year, and expenses were \$1,011.92.

The school has been well attended, and the Pastor has asked for help. Help arrived in the person of Christian Lohmann in 1889. He married one of Pastor Beckel's daughters and lived near the church. He worked until 1905 when the Church and Home Schools began to work together.

The Mouse does not have perfect pitch, but the Church bell is beginning to have a different sound. Upon closer inspection a crack has been found. This will require some expensive repair. We miss its sound and traditional ringing pattern. The Mouse would like to know your memories about bells and bell ringing.

FIRST ST. JOHN COUNCIL MINUTES - MARCH 15, 2011

The meeting was opened by the president, Bill Caldwell. Pastor Blohm did devotions. He read a passage from a book called Bread for the Journey. Attendance was taken and there were not enough to make a quorum, so no voting will occur. The minutes of the last meeting were read and no comments were made.

Treasurer's Report - Lisa gave the report. We are now \$8,000 behind, mostly due to snow removal. We had just \$3,200 in snow removal in February. We hope to make up the gap in the next couple of months.

Board of Education - On March 6th 105 people came out to bowl. JAM was open for the Dayschool open house. A slideshow of JAM was shown to the parents. The blood drive will be April 5th at the Lutheran Home in the common room. At this point 22 people have signed up to give. RENEW students have been meeting. JAM students will visit the Home on Palm Sunday to pass out palms to the residents. There will be interviews going on to find a Christian Education Director, hopefully beginning March 26. May 22 will be the Dayschool service honoring the kindergarten graduates. There will be a cookout after the service put on by the 150th anniversary committee. The Dayschool will sing in church on May 1st. The May 22nd service will be planned by the board and pastor.

Dayschool Report - Barb just had a board meeting today. Dayschool wants to minister more to the parents of the school, so some meetings will be scheduled with speakers. Students are enrolling for the upcoming school year. Open house was well attended. Lutheran Schools Week was celebrated by the Dayschool and the children had a good time.

Elders - Wedding has been added to the schedule.

Property Mgmt - No report.

Finance - Lisa gave the report. Thrivent Choice dollars are starting to come in on a monthly basis. This money comes from people who are investing with Thrivent and then they give to our church. The money will appear in the current fund.

Pastor Report - Confirmation will be April 3^{rd} . The elders will be testing them on March 28^{th} . The Synod Assembly is May 20 and 21 in Bowling Green.

Old Business - Bill talked a little on the planning of the 150^{th} anniversary. There will be wedding vow renewals at 4:30 on March 20^{th} at church with fellowship afterwards. On March 29^{th} there is a media day. There has been a history written about the beginning of the church.

There is a group called Rewind who wants to do a service for us sometime in May or June.

New Business - Brenda Fussell passed out information on a Zumba class that could happen here at the church. She would like some space for 2 nights a week. Council needs to check on insurance.

The meeting ended and we recited the Lord's Prayer.
