

The Mouse Report.

(From the Cemetery Mouse)

I saw some of you at the Memorial Day Cemetery Walk. Did you see me?

We prayed for a beautiful day to enhance our appreciation of our National Freedoms and 150 years in service to God's Kingdom. Many thanks to the Honor Guard from Christ Dunberger Post #537 of the American Legion for their support.

Did you hear our original church bell toll for each of the Veterans who gave their life while in uniform? We had no bell until the 1867/68 expansion of the first Church/Chapel. A new and larger bell purchased for the second building, (1876), cracked in 1889. The bell was sold back for scrap and the new bell with 1889 cast into it was removed from the second church at tear down in 1928. This is the bell we ring every Sunday to this day.

On February 20, 1894, God took our Pastor Beckel to Himself by a blessed death. He also served as director of the orphanage after Pastor Döerfler ended his connection to the orphanage. He attained the age of 59 years, 1 month and 27 days and served St. John from 1862 until 1894. He now slumbers in the same churchyard over which his paths so often led him

After the Rev. Gideon Rausch assumed the pastorate, a balcony was added for additional seating and a partial basement was dug so that a central heat furnace could be installed. The furnace cost under \$300 dollars. The Mouse will be warm now!

Rev. Rausch left in early 1900 and was succeeded by Rev. William Wacke. Our oldest members can still tell tales of spirited engagements while being schooled by him.

A new brick parsonage was constructed in 1904, but inside plumbing and electricity were yet to come. Seaman Street was a river of mud in the spring, but an enlarged outhouse with one end for males and the other end for the fairer sex was the talk of the community.

By 1910 improvements began. Some of the horse barns and hitching rails were removed. After a

general cleanup, October 15th 1911 was celebrated as the 50th anniversary of St. John Congregation.

The Mouse is warm in winter and enjoying the latest at St. John. Photography has become more affordable so enjoy some of the old photographs on display this sesquicentennial year.

This Mouse is approaching half of our history story. Is there a modern "Mouseketeer"out there to do the "Modern History?" See Toni in the church office if you are interested.

Bill then introduced Pastor Philabaum from Zoar Lutheran Church in Perrysburg. He came to speak on behalf of the Northwest Ohio Synod. He spoke of the ministries of the ELCA and also described what the Synod is all about. He also spoke of the amount of giving from First St. John to the different mission supports of the ELCA.

The minutes were then read from the last meeting. Bill asked for any changes or corrections. He asked for approval of the last few minutes. Dick Haar made a motion and Gary DeWitt seconded and the motion passed.

Board of Ed Report-Last date of Sunday School is May 22. The teachers will get together for a celebration of the year.

Elders Report-Wedding is covered for the weekend. They will be working to make sure people on Sunday will be taken care of. Some extra people will be coming to the service on May 29 from the East Toledo / Oregon Memorial Association.

Property Management Report-The group cleaned up the cemetery. They pulled a freezer from downstairs and it was sold at the rummage sale. They fixed a portion of the ceiling in the kitchen. Commercial Floors has been contacted to fix the back steps in the Ed. Building. Supposedly there is a leak in the Altar Guild room that will be looked into.

Finance Report-Lisa Anderson gave the report. Through the first 4 months we are ahead by \$3000 in the current fund, hopefully to continue through the summer months. Lawn care has begun and will be another expense like snow removal. A motion was made by Bernie Erdmann to approve the report and the past 3 months' reports. Linda Erdmann seconded it and the motion passed.

Christian Ed Director Report-Jamie Blazevich has met with Abbie Skorupa about Vacation Bible School. She has passed out information about the time and place. She has also made plans with the youth to help with games for the upcoming May 22nd service. She has attended two seminars to help her

with her job. She updated the logo for the church. She organized people for the Oregon Fest Parade. The adult Sunday School group also is planning something to do for the summer. On Sunday the Kindergarten graduates will be honored.

Dayschool Report-Barb Shellhammer gave the Dayschool report. She has all the areas covered for this service on May 22. On the 25th is the Kindergarten graduation. She needs a soundboard person for this graduation. The August service is the beginning of a new year, and Barb would like to start a Guardian Angel program for them. Families in our congregation would "adopt" a Kindergarten student; after the school year the student would meet his or her guardian angel and know that they have been thought of throughout their school year. Enrollment looks good for next year with 31 registered for Kindergarten. Summer program is heavily populated with 60 kids enrolled.

Old Business-Bill talked about the 150th anniversary. Bill talked about the Oregon Parade and felt it was successful despite the weather. He also talked about the May 30th memorial service in the cemetery for the servicemen. The service event will run from 8-11am.
