ere are a couple of Bible verses I have run across in the past month that I want to share. Each reminds us how important our attitudes are as we go about our lives day to day within our families, communities, and the church. I hope the Holy Spirit will give you the insight and inspiration you need and desire.

"Pleasant words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones." -Proverbs 16:24

It takes just as much energy to say a positive word as it does a negative one. In fact, it may take even less. Research has shown that when we speak positive words- even in difficult circumstances or troubling situations- our bodies relax. As we relax, blood flow increases, including the flow of blood to the brain. A well-oxygenated brain is much more likely to think creatively, make wise decisions, find reasonable solutions, and generate answers to questions.

Positive words ease relationships and create an atmosphere of peace conducive to rest, relaxation, rejuvenation, and sleep—all of which are necessary for good health.

On the other hand, contrary to popular thought, negative words do NOT release tension . . . they keep the body in a state of tension, constricting muscles and blood vessels. Irrational, uncreative, unreasonable behavior is a secondary effect.

A continual flow of negative words causes relationships to suffer, which creates an atmosphere of disharmony and makes for fitful sleep and frayed nerves- none of which are healthy!

One of the best things we can do for our overall health and the health of our relationships is to transform our speech habits! Such a transformation is indeed a gift of the Holy Spirit and might well be the best gift of "speaking in tongues" that a Christian should pray for and that we celebrate on Pentecost.

"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." -Philippians 4:8

One rainy day a woman overheard someone say, "What miserable weather!" She looked out her office window to see a big fat robin using a nearby puddle of water for a bathtub. He was splashing and fluttering, thoroughly enjoying himself. She couldn't help but think, "Miserable for whom? It's all a matter of perspective."

That's a lesson Lincoln Steffens learned as a young boy. He was watching an artist paint a picture of a muddy river. He told the artist he didn't like the picture because there was so much "mud" in it. The artist admitted there was mud in the picture, but what he saw were the beautiful colors and contrasts of the light against the dark.

Steffens later preached in a sermon, "Mud or beauty - which do we look for as we journey through life? If we look for mud and ugliness, we find them—they are there. Just as the artist found beauty in the muddy river, because that is what he was looking for, we will find in the stream of life those things which we desire to see. To look for the best and see the beautiful is the way to get the best out of life each day."

Even the Bible says that what you see is what you get! That is why each day we should pray for the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to see with the eyes of faith, and to behold the world through the gaze of the resurrected and risen Lord, Jesus Christ.

Keith asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Karen Holmes motioned to adjourn, LuAnn Spoerl seconded. Motion carried. Pastor closed meeting with a prayer.

Respectfully Submitted, Lynn Folk, Council Secretary President Keith Mullen opened the Tuesday, May 13, 2014 meeting at 7:40 PM, Pastor Rayl led with devotions

Secretary's Report: The minutes of the April meeting were read. Thank you to Chris Hunsaker for taking the minutes at the April meeting. A correction was made for the Applebee's Dine to Donate event as it is not on May 14 but on May 20. Luann Spoerl motioned to approve the minutes, Chris Hunsaker seconded. Motion passed.

Sunday School Report: Jamie Blazevich reported. May 3 we had VBS Preview in JAM, and on May 11 we held Pastries for Parents in which we thanked the JAM parents for their dedication to bringing their children to Sunday School. May 11 was our last day for JAM. Jamie will be going to the Synod Assembly on May 16 – May 18 at Kalahri. Oregon Fest – May 18, 2014. We will once again walk in the parade.

VBS is Monday, June 23 – Thursday, June 26. The theme is: Weird Animals VBS - Where Jesus' Love is One-of-a-Kind. God filled the world with a lot of crazy creatures...including you!

Elders Report: There are two upcoming weddings, June 7 and 21. Easter and Holy Week were well covered. The Dartball banquet was held here with 130 people in attendance. Team #2 from FSJ was the 1st place winner. On June 1, the summer schedule begins with one service at 9 AM.

Property Management: Dave Wilbarger discussed the mold issue from the leaky roof. They also discussed having a PM member be here for inspection, and Dave W. volunteered. The sink upstairs will be retrofitted as the part is no longer available. A bush will be removed in front of the building. Some latches on the new windows are not working well so the company will be coming back to take a look at them. We are out of spare shingles at this point as they were used for repairs.

A question on the parking lot was raised in connection with summer improvements. Could we patch instead of replace? Due to our budget, Mike Folk suggested resealing rather than putting in new. Gloria Ross stated we really need to know what costs are involved before further discussion is done.

The original quote was \$55,400 for a new parking lot in June 2012. PM will look into quotes for both a new lot and resealing. It was also suggested to get a quote on the education building roof replacement as well. The drainage system also needs to be looked at on the side of the church.

Treasurers Report: See attached. John Spoerl motioned to approve the minutes, Dave Wilbarger seconded. Motion carried.

Dayschool Report: Barb Shellhammer reported enrollment is growing. School board will meet next week to discuss how to honor Barb Uhler who recently passed away. Kindergarten recognition is this Sunday. The prayer buddy reception will follow. June 4 is kindergarten graduation at 7 PM; a screen operator is needed. June 5 is the last day of school, and June 10 is the beginning of the summer session. The Scrip program flyer was passed out with information of the stores involved. FSJ Dayschool gets a percentage back each time a card is purchased. October 8 is the LEAF Festival and planning is still ongoing. Lots of help is needed. Bill Caldwell states he is looking for corporate sponsors to help with the LEAF benefit.

Trikeathon is in September and will be held in Northwood on the same field as last year. There will be raffles and giveaways.

We are having a problem with the bees again. Can someone look into this?

It was requested to have the financial report from the Dayschool presented each month.

Pastor's Report: No transfers in or out. No baptisms in May, one in June. June 8 is the start of a new membership class. The constitutional review committee met last Monday with Bob Haar as the chair. More members are needed. Meetings are 1.5 hours and held the first and third Mondays of each month.

Synod meeting is this weekend at Kalahari, and we have our delegates set. Pam Beavers and Jamie have heard from the 8th graders that they would like to have a high school class in the fall.

A suggestion was made by several members to have the service piped in to the lounge so those who have health issues could be in the air conditioning.
