Iwas reading the other day where a Madison, Wisconsin-based group called the Freedom From Religion Foundation filed suit in Wisconsin claiming the National Day of Prayer is unconstitutional. ## MEMORIAL DAY CEMETERY TOUR VETERANS' INFORMATION NEEDED

As we note the calendar date of May 8, 1945 celebrating V E Day (Victory in Europe), we pause to reflect on the courage and dedication of our military men and women. Our First St. John Church cemetery is the final resting place of approximately 80 veterans who protected us during war and peace time from the Civil War to the present.

A copy of our veteran records is in the church lounge's 150th Celebration display area. As a salute to our deceased veterans, please take time to review the names and assist us in updating their military branches of service and tours of duty.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the Memorial Day annual cemetery salute provided by Christ Dunberger Post \#537 American Legion Honor Guard on Monday, May $30^{\text {th }}$. The ceremony will take place near the flag pole behind the church immediately upon the Legion Post's arrival, sometime between 8:30 and 9:30 am.

All are invited to a Walking Tour of the cemetery from 8:30-11:30 while we await the Legion Post's arrival. Members of the 150th celebration committee will be available to answer questions.

## Bells and Bell Ringing

(From the Church Mouse)
The response to the call for "bell memories" has been underwhelming, so I will report what little we know. At the congregational meeting held on June 30, 1889 the record states: "Since the bell developed a crack it was decided to purchase a new one with a higher tone, but the new bell would not be hung in place before it was examined. Then the old bell will be sold to the firm Vanduzen and Tift in Cincinnati, O. as a down payment." (Vanduzen and Tift survives today as the family-owned Virdin Company in Cincinnati. They cast the Ohio Centennial bells in each county and the giant Millennium Bell, too.)

The new bell cost $\$ .17$ a pound, and the foundry allowed $\$ .14$ a pound for the old bell metal. We have a $\$ 63.75$ receipt for the difference, which tells us the new bell is about 375 pounds heavier than the old. The new bell (still in use today) is listed by Van Duzen and Tift as 42 " across the lips weighing 1,400 pounds with a medium tone of "F."

Why a bell? Bells have been traced to a time before Christ. After the discovery of fire, melting metals soon followed. A piece of metal when dropped or struck vibrates and produces a "ringing" sound of some frequency. A collection of different sized pieces produces different frequencies. Thus the language of music was born.

Before modern technology, the church bell was the best means of communication over long distances. Before modern noise pollution, our church bell could be heard by the farmers near Curtice, Ohio. A "standard ringing" is considered 10 to 12 strikes (one tradition says 12 strikes, one for each disciple). A standard ring was performed Saturday at 6 PM as a reminder to attend Sunday services. On Sunday morning an early ring was performed at a set time before services so walkers and those traveling by horse and buggy could gauge the time and distance for a prompt arrival for services. Church bells also rung on the hour so everyone would know the time. After all, this was before "Timex" and a watch for everyone!

Standard rings were used at any hour of the day to send special coded messages, such as an ill member passing away. The standard ring would be followed by a single or double toll to indicate a male of female, followed by a toll for each year of age. (A toll is a single strike of the bell. A toller hammer has a separate rope pull from the rope used for rolling the bell in a standard ring.)

We do not have access to our 150 year old Chapel, but the bell from its steeple has been loaned to us by the Villhauer family for this sesquicentennial year. When the original Chapel was extended by 12 feet in 1867, a bell house and steeple were added. The bell cost $\$ 8.00$, and the rope was 85 cents. The bell was sold for $\$ 1.00$ at our cleanup in 1917. This bell will be mounted on a platform with wheels and can be viewed in different settings throughout the sesquicentennial year. The bell will first appear at the Memorial Day Cemetery Tour and in conjunction with the Christ Dunberger Post \# 537 American Legion Honor Guard Ceremony at 8:30AM on Memorial Day. The memorial service is conducted each year at Oregon cemeteries to honor those who served with the armed forces in fighting for our freedoms.

We have 80 recorded war veterans interred here at St. John, of which only four passed in uniform while on active duty: Charles Beichter, 1892 -1919, 88 Div. American Expeditionary Force, WWI. Richard Dickey, 11-7-1943 enlisted, 6-4-1944 MIA, 9-3-44 Lost at Sea, Merchant Marine, WWII. Karl Munzenmeyer, Africa, Sicily, Anzio, southern invasion of France where was lost 9-10-1944. WWII. William Schalkhauser, 1931 1961, Capt. 112 TAC FTR SQ Air Force Reserve. (Earl Snyder had been Gold Starred 3-22-42 after the Navy Battle of Java. Later, found 1-2-1944, POW.)

As patriotic Christian Americans we have much to be thankful for at this Memorial Service and 150 years at First St. John Church. The MOUSE will be there. If you see me, do not touch! Bring your cane, walker or sun glasses as needed.

All in all we were down $\$ 19,000$ earlier this year, but now are down $\$ 6,000$. This has come about by Mary departing and Jamie coming in. Hopefully with Easter we will get an increase in giving. In the first quarter of this year the church spent $\$ 2800$ on church activity. Current offering for the quarter has been $\$ 64,000$ as compared to giving a year ago at $\$ 58,000$, so it is up. Heating cost less this year than a year ago. There was a decline in real estate taxes somewhat. The Thrivent Choice Dollars program allows people to designate funds back to the church through Thrivent; we have received $\$ 1200$ dollars for the first quarter of the year. Jim said there will be an inventory of the church property. Jim has a prepared sheet for inventory for each group within the church.

Christian Education Director Jamie Blazevich gave her report on what she has been working on since she started this week. She is planning on getting St. Mark's youth and our youth together. She is updating some items on the website to put more on there for others to listen to. She is attending an online seminar for social technology. She has updated the church logo. Putting church info in the Blade to advertise service times, and she will check with Jim Sommers for funds to advertise. For the May $1^{\text {st }}$ service with the Dayschool children the bus will be used to help move people to the church. She talked about being in the Oregon Fest parade. She would like to purchase a $2 \times 6$ banner to carry.

Pastor Report Pastor Blohm welcomed the 3 confirmands: Kevin Witt, Brant Anderson, Bryce Anderson. Barb is to be congratulated for her teaching of the $7^{\text {th }}$ grade catechism class.
