NEWS FROM THE CHURCH MOUSE: 150 YEARS—MEMORIAL OR CELEBRATION?



Anniversaries are not always joyous celebrations! The anniversaries

of 9/11 or the passing of a parent or close friend are examples of solemn occasions. Birthdays and graduations are happier occasions worthy of celebration. In either case, the memorial or celebration is a "looking back" at the past. Celebrating our 150th anniversary here at First St. John has been mostly looking back. We have a firm foundation to celebrate and be thankful for. Hopefully, the younger among us will celebrate this foundation by having the wisdom to see what does and does not work and build upon it so future anniversaries will be celebrations rather than memorials.

The younger among us tend to tire of the stories of the hardships in olden times. One of my favorite often-repeated situations revolves around school days. The winters always were extremely cold with a lot of snow blown into tall drifts that were never cleared. There was no school bus and the winds were always strong. Now the grandchildren reply, "YEAH, and it was uphill going and coming from school!"

There is one place we go to learn that is not uphill in both directions. The First St. John sanctuary is not level! You can test this for yourself. If you stand on either the east or west side of the sanctuary and look across at the windowsills, which are level, you will see that the tops of the pews are lower on the Altar end than on the balcony end. The difference is nearly eight inches.

There are no drawings to check this design, but it has been field-tested a few times in the past. Today most of the offering are checks or paper money. There was a time when coins were about all most could afford. The offering plate became heavier as it neared the rear of the sanctuary. Older, feeble hands and small, youthful ones sometimes lost control, allowing the offering money to drop on the floor. The ultimate embarrassment was to have a coin or two land on its edges and roll from the back to the front of the sanctuary where it ended in an increasingly loud clatter as it finally came to rest flat on the floor.

The slight downhill approach to the communion rail may add to our relief as the burden of our sin is removed by confession and forgiveness. However, there is a practical reason for this arrangement. Think stadium seating to a smaller degree— the eye contact between pastor and parishioner is enhanced. The hearing of the Word also is enhanced. Jesus had these problems in his day. You may remember the crowds pressing in to hear him on the shores of Galilee where he asked his disciples to take him out a little in the fishing boat away from the shore so the crowds could hear him better.

The cathedrals in Europe and many churches here had raised pulpits with shaped roofs to project the pastor's voice. Some pulpits were on a second floor looking down on the congregation. Our own 1876 church had a pulpit with a clam shell cover that was over five feet above the floor. Our present pulpit originally was over two feet higher. Pastor Willer had difficulties climbing stairs and requested the pulpit be lowered. (You can compare photos of the pulpit in our 150th anniversary displays.)

A new trend is emerging today. Many clergy shun the pulpit since they can deliver a message to multiple locations with many amazing tools. I prefer some good eye contact and "feel the flesh" with a firm handshake!

In other building updates, we reported the move from a single outdoor restroom to separate facilities for men and women several years ago. An updated report tells us we now have over 50 plumbing fixtures on the grounds!

Have you seen the Mouse lately? We received the above reports from an unknown source. The Mouse is missing, and we have not received a ransom note!

If at any time this prayerful program would be something you would like to be a part of, let Jamie or I know and we will make sure you are equipped with all the needed information.

I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms. Ephesians 1:17-20

Finally, we're looking forward to another month of learning and growing together! We will visit the apple orchard and pumpkin farm, spend time with the clients of the Adult Day Center and the residents of the Lutheran Home, and we'll have our halloween parties the final week of October. Children will arrive in costumes, trick-or-treat for candy, and have chapel in the church where they will learn about faith and that they can let the light of Jesus shine in them! Lots to enjoy!

IMPORTANT REMINDER

The driveway behind the church is one-way. Please enter via the west driveway (the one closest to the Orphans Home [now Lutheran Homes offices]) and exit the east driveway coming from the Assisted Living building.

To avoid high traffic lines during school hours, please arrange your arrival time to after 9:05 am (a.m. class arrival), 11:35 am (a.m. class dismissal), 12:35 pm (p.m. class arrival), or 3:05 pm (p.m. class dismissal). This traffic flow pattern was established to protect our teachers and children as they arrive and depart our school. Please also refrain from cutting across the line of children arriving or departing school. Our children's safety is our top priority. Thanks.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—SEPTEMBER 20, 2011

Pastor opened the meeting with prayer. Bill Caldwell took roll call. 10 council members (49%) were present out of a total of 21 on council. Minutes from the last meeting on 8/9/11 were not approved as the meeting lacked a quorum.

Jim Sommers presented the financials for the month of August.

Board of Education Report – Karen Holmes. Rally Day was a success with 56 children attending. Fiftyone children, including some new children, attended JAM Fest. Looking for youth teachers for Sunday School. Jamie Blazevich, is filling in until we find someone with the focus on older youth this year. October 23rd is the date for Trunk & Treat in the church parking lot. We have two new kindergarten teachers downstairs, Sabrene Clair and Kimberly Grames. The classrooms in the church basement have been rearranged so all classes can be together. The Board of Ed is brainstorming ways to document and recognize the history of the Dayschool and its founders as part or our 150 year anniversary celebration.

Elders Report – 3 members in attendance. There are four weddings in October. Elders have adjusted their schedules to cover all activities while Bernie Erdman recovers from surgery. Pastor gave an update on Bernie's condition and he is now home.

Property Management Report. Repair projects completed or in progress:

- A roof leak repaired over the lounge.
- The flat roof over the Altar Guild room was replaced at a cost of \$1,700. The Trustees are working with the insurance company to repair damages resulting from the leak including damage to the organ speakers.
- Parking lot across from church is in bad need of repair for cracks. Alternatives to fix this are being worked on. Goal is to repair before winter when more damage would be done.
- Additional security lighting was installed in the back parking lot behind the church
- Leaking toilets were fixed
- Sprinklers for flowers in front of church to be winterized.

Treasurers Report – Lisa Anderson. There is a \$14,000/15,000 shortfall for the month. Hopefully, we can make this up in the next 4 months.

Finance Committee Report – Jim Sommers. Jim presented council with a proposed purchase by Betty Hyre of new "risers" with wheels for the Sunday School singers. The cost is \$2,447. There is \$2,000 in the children's choir fund. A recommendation was made to use \$1,500 from the children's choir fund and the balance from the Bosse fund. Larry Paul made a motion to purchase and Dick Haar seconded it. Bill Caldwell will call the absent Council members to ask for their vote as a majority vote is required to spend these monies.

These long term expenditures were discussed:

Replace windows in the educational building - \$72,400 The windows are 50 years old and in bad need of replacement.

Repair/replace parking lot across the street from the church. The Trustees are obtaining quotes. Once the finance committee knows all the costs and determines how this affects the overall church budget, a congregational meeting will be held to determine next steps.

Jim Sommers, Finance Chairman, announced that we need more contributions coming in to offset the costs of these large projects.

Youth Report / Day School Report – Jamie Blazevich, Christian Education Director discussed the following activities:

Prayer Buddy – pairing someone from church with a Dayschool kindergartner to support the child in mind and prayer. Goal is to invite them at the end of the school year to meet. If interested, let Jamie know. There are 30 kindergartners.

Putting together a "Mom's group" for women with children in varying ages to support them during transition. No date set, but a "gathering" as such to get to know one another at quarterly meeting. Long term goal is to meet once a month.
