anuary, 2012 – can you believe it? Here we are, 12 years (or is it 11 years?) into the 21st century. Each new year tends to remind us of years past, of the "good old days" when life was different and we were younger.

Our resident published author, office administrator, wife, and dog owner, Toni Wilbarger, recently had an article published in *The Christian Communicator*, a Christian writing magazine. Her article might help us to see things from a new and better perspective. Here is Toni's article:

Reasons for Joy

I once read about a woman who spent so much time on the couch that her skin fused to the cushions. Although I didn't go that far, I did lay on my couch for many hours over several months watching TV reruns and mourning the loss of "the good old days." I wallowed in waves of discontent.

My "good old days" seemed full of promise and excitement as I pursued my dream of writing and selling novels. I attended conferences where I met agents and editors. I mailed dozens of book proposals to publishers and agents. Sometimes those "in the know" praised my writing. But after 12 years of hard work, I had nothing to show for my efforts.

I dreaded running into acquaintances because they'd always ask, "So, how's the writing going?" Rejection after rejection crushed my hopes. I thought about how happy I was when I started my dream and how miserable I was now. My stomach felt as if someone had punched me. I couldn't wait to go to bed each night and escape into sleep. Finally, I gave up my dream.

But once my dream was gone, I had no idea what to do. Cleaning the house, paying the bills—was that all my life was supposed to be? If so, then my life was meaningless. *I* was meaningless. I was waiting for lightning to strike, for the answer to hit me between the eyes. Until it did, I was not moving from the couch.

After several months, I decided I couldn't watch television my entire life. Another stupid TV show? Another laugh track? I turned off the TV and reached for the Bible. I wanted to read something that fit my mood, and I remembered Solomon writing in the book of Ecclesiastes that everything was meaningless. Yeah, that summed up my life.

But once I started reading, I realized Solomon's wisdom was not confined to his proverbs. In Ecclesiastes 5:19b, 20 he writes about contentment: "To enjoy your work and accept your lot in life—that is indeed a gift from God. People who do this rarely look with sorrow on the past, for God has given them reasons for joy."

If enjoying my work and accepting my life were gifts from God, then I desperately needed them. I asked God to help me accept the life He'd given me, to enjoy my work, and to stop looking backward with sorrow and longing. God showed me that whatever I'd accomplished and whatever I owned were gifts from Him. He'd given me good health, a loving husband, a nice home, a job, and enough money to meet my needs. That was more than many people had—more than I deserved. As I accepted those gifts and learned to focus on God, the Giver, I dwelled less on the dream I had not achieved.

Getting off the couch and asking God for help were my first steps toward contentment. I still catch myself looking backward, so I know I have more steps ahead. But I'm learning to thank God for what I have instead of torturing myself with what I don't. When I thank Him for my life, contentment follows because I know He has given me "reasons for joy."

"PAY IT FORWARD"

On Sunday, November 27, 2011, President Bill Caldwell explained the church had more than enough money to help with remaining 150th anniversary committee expenses, and that First St. John would like to pay it forward rather than just helping ourselves. To that end, everyone in church that day received \$10 and was given instructions to pay it forward. The only rules were you could not spend it on yourself and you could not put it back in the offering plate.

Some sent their money to various charities, including the Cherry Street Mission, Salvation Army, Oregon Food Baskets, Gideon's International (an organization that distributes Bibles around the world), The Daughter Project, the YMCA scholarship fund, STNA program scholarship at Lourdes College, and local charity events. Others put their \$10 in with some monetary donations from their friends and purchased food for the Cherry Street Mission, along with some candy canes for Christmas. Many folks added money of their own or got their friends to help, too!

Here are emails and notes that have been shared with the church office:

I was driving down Navarre Ave. going past K-Mart near Wendy's and saw a man wrapped in a blanket next to his grocery cart filled with his possessions. Another man had stopped to talk to him. As I neared the old Foodtown, I said to myself, "Turn around and go back and give that guy the \$10 in your purse." I turned and drove through the parking lot to Dustin and down to K-Mart. As I approached the man, another lady stopped and gave him some money. I walked up to the man and gave him the \$10 and he said to me, "I can't even get a motel room, I have no ID." After he said that, I was thankful to come home to a warm house and have a soft bed to sleep in that night.

Where my daughter works, they give away food to the needy every month. They were requesting peanutbutter or mac-n-cheese as their supplies were low. We purchased 55 boxes of mac-n-cheese and, to give a little holiday cheer, 55 boxes of candy canes. We gladly spent more than the two \$10 amounts we received. ** SIDE NOTE: Kroger was holding the 55 candy cane boxes for me. When I checked out, the cashier asked why I needed so many boxes. I shared our church's pay it forward project, and she was intrigued by the idea. She often thought about giving to a food bank, but thought some people took advantage of the program. I told her that this particular program verifies the families receiving aid are deserving and that the need is great. I overheard her sharing our church's challenge with some co-workers as I walked away. Maybe a little seed was planted from the idea our church started? Hopefully they took on the initiative!

We read an item in The Press the day after the church's wonderful gesture. It mentioned a benefit for a Sylvania family struggling with medical problems. The mother has had non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma for five years and has been in remission. During that time, her husband was diagnosed with leukemia. This past year her Lymphoma returned and she has had to undergo a stem cell transplant. They are a couple in their late 40s with three children. They certainly seemed good candidates for our gift, so we added a bit more to our \$20 and mailed it along with a note to the family. I told them they could pay it forward by keeping the faith and letting their light shine for others. (The following is a copy of the thank you note this family received.)

"Thank you so much for your generosity. I have shown many of my friends your touching card. You sent more than a gift of money. I, too, will pay it forward as soon as I can, and you can bet I will never forget what giving and loving people can do to change things for the better. Merry Christmas!

Our friends' daughter is suffering from a very rare type of cancer, Angiosarcoma. Because of the rarity of her disease, she has been forced to travel to Texas in order to receive treatment. Along with an additional donation, we used First St. John's "Pay it Forward" monies to help support this girl in her fight against cancer.

We always buy for a family that my husband's workplace adopts for the holidays, but this time we bought what they requested but added an extra gift as a surprise. Our son gave a \$10 tip to a waitress at Cafe Marie's.

We matched the money and sent it to a woman who could certainly use it. We soon received a thank you note saying she was literally down to her last dollar when the money arrived. I told others about her letter, and they doubled their money and sent it to her also. I received a thank you call from her.

One couple doubled their \$20 with their own money and used it to purchase socks for the Hannah's Socks collection at First St. John. Someone else bought hats and gloves and donated them to Ravens Claw in Defiance

A friend of our grandchildren died at the age of 26, leaving a 7-month-old baby. Her husband had just lost his job. She had no life insurance because of a pre-existing heart condition. We were happy to "pay forward" to help pay her funeral expenses.

For this next story, our First St. John member did not send this in, but instead, we received this thank you note in the mail from a pay-it-forward recipient:

"On November 30th I was down to my last 23 cents. I stopped by my friend's work place just to say hello, and she said she had something for me and gave me the pay it forward gift. Oh, what a blessing, and it couldn't have come at a better time. God always takes care of His children if we just let Him. Thank you for this gift. I will pay it forward, too. 'Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. — 1 Thessalonians 5:18"

For many years I've been knitting hats, mittens, scarves & baby blankets and sending them to the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota. At Christmas, I usually include some cash, so this year I added my \$10.00. I have received a thank you as their need is so great.

Our 6-year-old daughter received the \$10 and was so excited thinking about things she could do with the money. We wrote down her choices and decided that we could actually accomplish two things on her list. She was able to buy a Barbie doll for one of the families from Project Give a Blessing as well as donate the other \$5 to the collection plate at her Dad's work. Trivia 1: All confirmations have been performed by a "called" pastor of First St. John, except one. Our first called pastor, Carl Beckel, passed away on February 20, 1894. Our second called pastor, Gideon Rausch, did not come until late in 1894. The confirmation class of 1894 was April 29th and was signed by Rev. C. Prottengeier, pastor of St. John Lutheran, South Side, 1871 - 1895.

St. John South Side at that time was a "sister" congregation like St. Paul downtown is today. Salem, sometimes referred to as the "mother" of Lutheran churches in Toledo, organized many churches in the 1860's, since the distance of travel to Salem was a great inconvenience.

Why do we have "sister" congregations, cities and so on? Why not "brother" relationships? I suppose we have to return to our Germanic heritage. In German, the word "the" takes three different forms based on gender. Der = masculine, die = feminine and Das is neutral. We must always know the gender of the subject to be grammatically correct. The words city and church are feminine, so I suppose our German forefathers were true to "die" old traditions and used "sister" rather than "brother" relationships. After all, we were only a vote short of speaking German rather than English in this country. And did you know that President Reagan, in 1987, proclaimed October 6th as German-American Day?

Trivia 2: When was the largest church attendance recorded *? The Festival of Easter on March 29, 1959, at two services totaled 1,401. Sunday School was 681. From the bulletin: WHAT DOES EASTER MEAN TO YOU? WILL YOU BE AT CHURCH NEXT SUNDAY?

The runner up was The Festival of Easter, April 17, 1960. The total for two services was 1,233 at church and 603 for Sunday School. From the bulletin: "The Ladies Aid was sponsoring a trip to Detroit to see Cinerama ** 'South Sea Adventure."

Trivia 3: Since our newspapers are filled with as many or more dog than people stories, is it true that a human year is equivalent to seven dog years? If that is true, how many Mouse years equal one human year? I think it is time for this Mouse to disappear.

ANNUAL CONGREGATION MEETING —DECEMBER 11, 2011

The meeting, beginning at the 7:45 service, was called to order by Pres. Bill Caldwell. Bill talked about the symphony and discussed parking and that there will be many people attending. When people are seated, please don't save seats, and please be polite to those who need seats. A coat check will be available in the basement of the church. The ladies of WELCA will have refreshments in the gym.

Bill had the ballots and the budget passed out and Lisa Anderson gave the financial report. Right now the church is \$13,000 short for the year. Better than last year. She is confident we will be able to meet these expenses by the end of this year. She thanked those who are Thrivent members. The contributions from Thrivent were about \$5000 this year. Lisa also talked about a family who has had their family home burned and a special envelope designated for funds to help them. Also, the tree in the Narthex has cards on it for another family.

She also spoke about electronic giving options. Go to the site and do an online giving, but follow the link. It should make giving easier when you are not in attendance.

She turned over the meeting to Jim Sommers. He spoke about the budget for 2012. He thanked the members for their continued support and also for making the 150th year a good one. He spoke about salaries and benefits. There is an increase in salary structure. The last two years have had no increase. This year the committee felt it was necessary to give raises. A 3% percent raise has been given to full time employees. The former youth director was getting \$22,500 plus benefits, but when the new C.E. Director came she didn't need benefits so it was given in salary. The committee will give her 1% increase. The remainder of the structure has remained the same. Increase in Social Security due to salary increases. Maintenance is staying the same for normal operations including snow removal and repairs. Some major items in the future will need to be taken care of for the church and we will need to appropriate proper funds.

Chris Hunsaker spoke for WELCA and gave a check to the church for \$5000 to be used for improvements.

Jim talked about the real estate taxes. After 6 years of 11

working with the property and seeing it surveyed and categorized properly, we have been able to lower our taxes. The assessment now is finally correct. We received a rebate for \$3900.

Debt retirement is under way, and he reminded the congregation we have borrowed from our special funds

He asked for any questions. Dick Crouse asked about the salary for the CE Director and stated the secretary doesn't get benefits, either.

Gave meeting back to the President. Bill spoke about the ballot. He asked for nominations from the floor and there weren't any. He told them to mark the ballots and thanked the people finishing their last terms.

There was an adjournment till next service.

Bill opened up the meeting at the 10:15 service. He asked the ushers to pass out the budget and the ballots. Bill talked about the symphony, again covering the parking, coat check, seating and the gathering afterwards.

He asked Lisa and Jim to talk about the finances and budget, repeating what was said at the first service. (See above paragraphs covering finances and giving and expenses.)

After Lisa, Jim spoke directly to the budget for 2012. He started with salaries (see paragraphs above). Again, Chris Hunsaker presented a check from WELCA to go the improvement fund. Jim reexplained the tax rebate given by Lucas County. After explaining the budget, he asked for questions. No questions were asked.

Bill explained the ballot for election of people on the various committees. He then thanked everyone who was done serving their term.

He asked for questions. None were asked. He adjourned the meeting.

Barb Shellhammer and Jamie have been working on By Design, a new group for young moms, both in the Dayschool and the community. A blood drive is slated for April. A ladies overnighter in February is being worked on by Lori Pfeiffer and Jamie.

Pastor Report On January 8 there will be installation of officers. January 15 baptism for Sawyer Mullen. The 22nd at both services will be the Family Blessing Sunday.

Old Business – Positive comments were received about the Toledo Symphony concert. Bill

commented on the amount of help from the congregation and wants to thank them for making it all happen.

New Business – None.
