NEWS FROM THE CHURCH MOUSE

Your church/cemetery mouse has many mouse friends. One of them is a barn mouse who lives in on a local farm. Here is a true story he told me.

The farmers who own the barn had friends who live in a Detroit suburb and worship at a Lutheran church. Every August approximately 30 parishioners come to the German American Festival at Oak Shade, and they camp at Maumee Bay State Park. On Sunday morning before returning home, they have a worship service at one of their campsites. This farmer's friends asked them to join them this particular Sunday morning. As the farmers were heading to the campsite church, a rainstorm came and blew down their campsite tent.

A few people got discouraged and went back up north, but about twenty-five folks stayed and tried to figure out where to have church. Everything looked very bleak until the farmer said, "I will move a farm truck out of my barn, and we will have church there. Get in your cars and follow me."

They arrived at the farm, the farmer moved the truck out of the barn, a picnic table was set up, and there just "happened" to be enough folding chairs for everyone. The pastor stayed behind, and everyone was happy to be where it was warm and dry. Never mind the tractors, tractor parts, tools and other "barn" type stuff all over— these folks were ready to worship. Pastor even had her guitar for music. Worship was about to begin when someone noted that the family with the communion wafers and the wine had gone back to Detroit. What to do?

"God has taken care of this, too," said the farmer. "We have Johlin wine, the wine our church uses, plus soda crackers, small paper cups and fruit juice."

While the rain was hitting the barn roof, the hens could be heard clucking in their nests in the chicken coop. These folks from the city, the barn mouse, and the farmers had their very first "church in a barn," and it was WONDERFUL.

After my friend the barn mouse finished his story, I remembered that First St. John began its ministry worshipping in local barns. It's nice to know that church in the barn still continues.

FROM JAMIE'S DESK

Mark 4:20

"Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop—thirty, sixty or even a hundred times what was sown."

Good Soil

In the parable of the soils Jesus tells of different types of people who hear the gospel. Only some people hear the word of God and accept it and will bear fruit as a result of this.

As a seed reaches maturity, it produces a great harvest in light of what was invested. One seed does not return one seed, it returns dozens of tomatoes or years of apple harvesting.

Bearing fruit takes time, and some of us will take longer to reach maturity than others. Some Christians go through years of backsliding after their initial profession of faith before they get their life together. Others see a rapid change in their life.

Christians are going to have different levels of production. God has gifted each person differently, and we should not expect each Christian to do the same things. Some people are going to be the equivalent of the crop that is thirty times what was sown, while others are going to be like the crop that is sixty or a hundred times what was sown.

We are called to bear fruit. The amount that is produced depends on our maturity and how we are gifted. We have control only over our own maturity. Produce fruit and strive for maturity. Don't worry about the results. God is looking for fruit, not the numbers.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES—SEPTEMBER 18, 2012

Pastor Blohm opened with a devotional reading. Keith Mullen called meeting to order. Attendance was taken. Tonight's meeting did not have a quorum so no voting could take place.

Rachel Noleff from the Lucas County Health Department gave a presentation on how our church community could volunteer to serve as a site that would host an "Open POD" (Point of Dispensing) during a major medical/natural disaster.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT - Jamie Blazevich reported the youth room has all new furniture. The 8th grade catechism class will meet there. The 7th grade will meet in the gym. Catechism was awesome with 22 students attending. The first class was learning about how to Acolyte and be a Cross Bearer. This Sunday will begin the classroom curriculum.

Rally Day was awesome! 60 children attended. Crazy Craig the Juggler was wonderful. Last Sunday was the first actual day of classes, and there were 44 children that attended JAM and 22 students for catechism.

Trunk or Treat is scheduled for October 21st from 2:00 - 4:00 pm. More details to come. Have been in contact with Mike Winslow about planning a dance party for the future.

Prayer Buddy connections are being made. We had so many individuals wanting to participate this year that we were able to include another addition to this terrific program.

By Design will be the second and fourth Wednesday of the month. Our first meeting on October 24th will include a speaker about parenting. We are in contact with two speakers.

Our Discount Card Fundraiser will start on Tuesday, September 25th after the conclusion of the "Save Around the Town" fundraiser the Dayschool is doing. We challenge each council member to sell 10 cards. Jamie has a sign-up sheet. If we sell all the cards our profit is \$3,225. This will be used as extra income for the Youth and JAM programs.

Property Management would like all groups to clean out/straighten up their area where items are stored. ALL groups will be contacted as to how they can help the church stay in compliance with future fire/ insurance inspections.

TREASURER – Jim Sommers produced a report that showed a shortfall for the month of negative \$9,136.08 due to some repair expenses and low donations for the previous month. He continued the report by adding a year-to-date total of a negative \$13,469.12 shortfall for the year. Next year's budget is being worked on and all groups are asked to submit their budget proposal in writing.

DAYSCHOOL - Barb Shellhammer reported that Prayer Buddies have been assigned. She reminded all who have signed up to mark your calendars for the end of the year "reveal."

Scholarships were distributed to Dayschool families at our Rally Day/Teacher Recognition service. This year, WELCA donated the scholarships. These are randomly drawn from the names of people attending this service who are enrolled in our Dayschool. In addition, five children from our kindergarten class have been awarded the George & Elaine Ackerman Scholarship. These children are selected by the Dayschool Board of Education based on financial need.
