he Bible uses many names to describe Jesus and His mission on earth: Wonderful Counselor, Prince of Peace, The Lamb of God, just to name three. But one name we don't see or hear very often is taken from Revelation 22:16: "It is I, Jesus, who sent my angel to you with this testimony for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star." Actually, Jesus is probably referring here to one of the earliest scripture passages about Himself -- we find it in Numbers 24:17: "A star shall come out of Jacob, and a scepter shall come out of Israel." But how is the "star" of Christmas truly such Good News? All throughout the Bible darkness is used as a metaphor for evil, for being in rebellion against God. And even today, that darkness and rebellion toward God lies in each of our hearts.

But into this dark, evil, and selfish world, the prophet in the book of Numbers promises hope to the people: "A star shall come out of Jacob."

But there's another connection! Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, recognized the "star" coming into the world in Luke 1:78-79: "Because of the tender mercy of our God . . . the sunrise shall visit us from on high to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."

The Bright Morning Star has arrived in the Person of Jesus Christ. The evils of this dangerous, sinful world will not last forever-Our Morning Star is coming! The shadows of sin and death will not last forever- Our Morning Star is coming! Let us together prepare our hearts and minds for Jesus, "the root and the descendant of David, (and) the bright morning star!"

Please tear off the front stapled ornament, then write your name and number on the other paper ornament and leave it on the tree.


