### The Other Cross

Among many Easter symbols, the Cross is most prominent since it symbolizes the culmination of Jesus' work on earth. The prominence and expression of the cross change as the Lenten Season moves forward. The Altar Guild faithfully and without fanfare fulfills the rituals.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Our gold altar cross is exchanged for the "other cross" of thick dark wood. The other side is hollow and lighted so that the cross appears to be a shadow. The maker is uncertain, but it came to us in the late 1940's.

On the right side of the Nave, a second "other cross" also appears. This man-size rugged cross stands in a miniature Joseph's garden and is draped with a purple cloth. Marge Myers recently submitted a 1970's photograph of her father, William (Bill) Beichter (1898-1977), and this cross which he constructed at the request of Pastor Buenting.



We can be and see the other side of this cross. From here our thoughts and prayers may be best expressed in the words of the Statler Brother's song, "The Other Side of the Cross:"

There were tears in the eyes of Jesus There were nails in the palms of His hands There were thorns in his brow and only God could know how

Much pain he could withstand

There was blood all around the hillside As a mother mourned her loss And we all stood to gain from the heavenly pain On the other side of the cross
