Where in the world would you like to go if you had the chance? If money were no object and the air fare, hotel costs, meals, and spending money were all being provided, what destination would you pick? Such an opportunity does not come often, so you would not want to squander it.

Think carefully. Would you visit the family you don't see often enough and treat them to the time of their lives? Would you go to all the exotic faraway places you have heard about all your life and only dreamed of seeing? How about a trip around the world, or time spent on a quiet, warm South Seas island? It is your choice.

Now that you are thinking about travel, let's go off on a wilder tangent. Suppose Jules Vern's fantasy was realized and a method of time travel has been developed. If you could choose any moment in history to travel back to see, what would it be? What about traveling back to Biblical times? What would you pick? Creation itself? Moses dividing the Red Sea or descending from Mt. Sinai with the Ten Commandments?

What about the events that took place during the time of Jesus? Would you want to be in the crowd when Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount? How about the feeding of the five thousand, the raising of Lazarus from the dead, being on the Mount of Transfiguration with Peter and James and John, or in the Upper Room for the Last Supper? Which of us would pass up the opportunity to stand with Mary, Peter and John in the garden on Easter morning to look inside the empty tomb or be greeted by the resurrected Lord for the first time? Any of these would certainly send your faith into orbit!

I wonder how many of us, though, would choose to join the crowds outside Jerusalem at the foot of the cross to witness Jesus' crucifixion? Perhaps this would be too difficult, too painful.

Yet, to look into those eyes, to see that face, to hear those words, "Father, forgive them!" and, unlike that ancient crowd, to know that his words were meant for us- to believe they carry the promise of new life from the living Lord- what a faith enriching moment!

Well, in truth, we don't need a time machine to visit these last two events. The crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ are part of our lives every day through our baptisms. Remember the Apostle Paul's words - "All of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death. We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." (Romans 6:3-4)

Each day, we can and must return to the cross and the empty tomb in our baptismal remembrances. Life is empty if we do not see the cross. Life is too large a cross to bear if the empty tomb is not there. Whenever our $\sin$ and failures beat us down, the cross shines bright with God's forgiveness and acceptance, and God's perfect love already given and proven (read Ephesians 2:1-5). Whenever our confidence wavers and hope begins to slip away, the empty tomb proclaims that victory is assured even though it is hidden for the moment beneath a veil of pain or sorrow. Because the very same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work to save everyone who puts their faith and trust in Jesus Christ (read Ephesians 1:18-23).

So here is your chance to visit the cross and empty tomb. Don't miss the opportunity. God has already paid for the trip. Come and follow Jesus, the crucified and risen Lord. Take him at his word: "He who believes and is baptized shall be saved." Don't wait to take advantage of this once-in-a-lifetime offer. And as an added benefit, you will receive an eternal frequent flyer bonus.
