ne of the items in Ripley's *Believe It or*Not Museum is a plain bar of iron. The description reads that as a plain bar of iron, it is valued at \$5.

#### **CEMETERY NEWS**

Dear Friends of the Cemetery,

As many of you have probably realized, there are new signs at each driveway stating the rules for the cemetery. The rules are the same as they've always been, however, we are asking you to please review them and keep them in mind when tending to your loved ones' graves.

#### The rules are:

- ♦ Hours are dawn to dusk
- Spring cleanup begins March 15th. Fall cleanup begins October 15th. Decorations not removed by the family will be discarded.
- Families are responsible to removing decorations when they become unsightly or they will be discarded.
- All decorations are limited to 12 inches in front of the headstone only.
- Glass floral containers, metal stakes, stone, marbles, fencing or edging materials, statues, benches, or the planting of trees, shrubs and bushes is not permitted.

Fall clean up of the cemetery will be October 15th. Anything in violation of the cemetery rules will be removed on October 15th, so <u>please</u> remove any items you may wish to keep before then.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and support. A lot of work has gone into getting the cemetery to this point, and we deeply appreciate everyone's efforts so we can continue to be proud of our cemetery.


