ur time of tears throughout Lent has come to a happy ending with tears of joy over the Resurrection. A father took his little boy to a pet shop to pick out a puppy for his birthday present. For half an hour he looked at the assortment in the window. "Decided which one you want?" asked his Daddy. "Yes," the little fellow replied, pointing to one that was enthusiastically wagging his tail. "I want the one with the happy ending." For all the tears of sorrow, disappointment, and tragedy of Lent, Easter is a Happy Ending to this season. Christ's glorious resurrection has turned them into tears of joy. Tears on Easter? Yes, tears of a happy ending to sin, sorrow, death, and tragedy. Now we can say "HAPPY EASTER" and really mean it!

Tears of joy come to us at Easter because we have in the resurrected Christ the truth of God, ourselves, and our salvation. When Mary Magdalene recognized the risen Jesus, she exclaimed, "Rabonni!" meaning "Teacher." Of all possible names, the one that instinctively came to her was the one that dealt with his teaching the truth. We need to know and understand the truth of God for our stability and security. Without the truth, we are confused. We want answers and solutions; we already have plenty of questions and problems. We are on sinking sand until we have the truth, and then our feet are on solid rock. Like Mary, we want to take hold of Jesus, the truth, and not let go.

Knowing the truth is reason for rejoicing. On Easter day we rejoice with tears of joy because we have the truth in the Risen Christ; for the whole Christian faith ultimately rests on the resurrection—that the One who was crucified is also the One who is risen from the dead. If Christ did not rise from the dead, our faith would be in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:14ff)

The Resurrection gives us the truth that God can be trusted. It says to us that God is in control of the world and our lives. It was God who raised Jesus. It was God who did what no human could do—God rolled away the stone from the tomb. On Good Friday, we

wondered where God was and how could God allow his Son to be crucified. Even Jesus in a moment of supreme obedience and sacrifice cried out, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?" And in so doing Jesus gave voice to the deepest and ultimate question of our shared human experience, even if that question remains unexpressed except in "sighs too deep for words"

Praise God that in the light of Easter we now know that God was in the shadows, suffering and dying in Jesus. Behind the overcast sky of doubt and tribulation the sun of God shines, and one day the sun of God's love and presence will shine through. As the Gospel according to John declares, "The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." The reality of God's living and abiding love is witnessed in the Resurrection. How happy we are to know that God lives and reigns!

Easter, moreover, gives us the truth of Jesus. Is he or is he not God's Son, the Messiah, the Redeemer, and our Savior? When he suffered and died on a cross like the two thieves, we may have had doubt that his words were true. He said, "The Father and I are one," and "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Now we know his words are solid truth. No other person was raised to new life from the dead. No other religious leader, no wise sage, no ruler with power had that experience. Of all the billions of people that ever lived, only one was raised to new life from the dead. Jesus, for a fact, is God's only Son. He *does* have the authority to forgive our sins, and he *does* have the power to save us. Oh, what wonderful truth that rejoices the heart! Now I know that my Redeemer lives, and I am sure I can put my whole trust in him for eternal life.

Rejoice in the truth that the final outcome is good. In a world where evil, corruption, and crime seem to succeed, we may wonder at times whether God or Satan is in control of the world. Easter gives us the truth: Good will ultimately win out. Love is stronger than hatred. Out of death will come life. This is most certainly true. You can base your life on it.



We have told the children a great deal about Jesus and now they can tell us the good news as we sit around the cross at our Easter celebrations. Out of the mouths of babes we hear how much He loves us, exactly what He did for us and why, and about the assurance of our heavenly home. All adults present are awed by the children's ability to share their faith. The purpose of your Dayschool is to plant these truths in the hearts of young children. We want them to know without a doubt that He is their Lord! Thank you all for believing in the importance of this ministry.

Attention Prayer Buddies: SAVE THE DATE —On Sunday, May 17th a service recognizing our kindergarten children and their successful completion of the school year will take place. After the service the children will be introduced to their prayer buddy. Thank you, Prayer Buddies, for keeping these children in your constant prayers. I know how much it means to the families of our kindergarten students to know someone is praying for their child. Our Father tells us over and over that prayer is the best thing we can do for each other, so thank you for lifting these children and their families up to Him. You are a witness to many!

The price difference is an instant rebate for our school. Great Lakes Scrip offers over 300 of the country's biggest brands, including Meijer, Walmart, Target, Bob Evans, Burger King, Circle K, BP Gas, Speedway, Lowe's, Home Depot and more. This is an ongoing program with gift card orders being sent in every other week. Cards usually arrive about three days after an order is placed. Order forms are available in the Narthex and outside of the

church office. Please consider how you could use gift cards to help our school.

Attention all Spring Cleaners: If you have any ribbon, rick-rack, material, doilies, old buttons, sequins, beads, or the like, you can drop them off at the Dayschool office and I will find a good use for them. The children are quite good at creating masterpieces from scraps! A special thanks to those who already think of us often.

Secretary: February minutes – Motion made to accept the minutes by John Spoerl, seconded by Mike Winslow, motion carried.

Regular meeting was temporally diverted to allow Bill Caldwell to present a "Special Funds" report to the council members. Special Funds report provided information about the funds maintained by the Special Funds Committee, comprised of members from First St. John Lutheran Church. This "Special Funds Committee" has been in existence for the past 34 years. Funds include: Memorial, Housing, Cemetery, Endowment, George Ackerman Scholarship, Air Conditioner.

This committee has supplied financial records to the church council, published an annual report, sought council approval for funds to help maintain, repair, or invest designated fund money, financed debt for church capital improvements, and solicited thousands of dollars of donations to these funds.

A request came from the Special Funds committee to use money from the Memorial Fund to purchase 2 new altar Bibles that are in desperate need of replacement. LuAnn Spoerl made a motion to accept, Pam Beavers seconded the motion, motion carried.

Discussion was held over how to possibly invest for the future of the church. Additional information was provided to the council by an "Investment Committee" about possible opportunities to invest money into Mutual Funds (Thrivent) or into Endowment Funds Pooled Trust (an ELCA Foundation). Discussions were held as to an amount, pro's and con's of each program, and long-term investment possibilities. Council recommended to the Special Funds Committee to do further research on which fund option would be in the best interest of First St. John. Then, if necessary, council will discuss further. Bob Haar made a motion to table discussions until April's meeting to allow Special Funds committee to do further research. LuAnn Spoerl seconded the motion, motion carried.

Pastor Rayl also felt it important to mention that the support of the members of First St. John helped make up the 2014 budget shortfalls, and that no money was used from Special Funds!
