o you miss life-changing opportunities because of short sightedness? It can happen by putting limits on where God might be taking you. Consider this example.

A fellow approached a cab driver in New York and said, "Take me to London."

The cab driver told him there was no possible way for him to drive across the Atlantic.

The customer insisted there was. "You'll drive me down to the pier, we'll put the taxi on a freighter to Liverpool, you'll drive me to London, where I'll pay you whatever is on the meter."

The driver agreed and when they arrived in London the passenger paid the total on the meter, plus a thousand dollar tip.

The driver roamed around London, not quite knowing what to do. Then an Englishman hailed him and said, "I want you to drive me to New York."

When the passenger began to say, "First, we take a boat . . ." the driver cut him off.

"That I know. But where do you want to go in New York?"

The passenger replied, "Riverside Drive and 104th Street."

The driver shrugged his shoulders, shook his head, and responded, "Sorry, I don't go to the west side."

Jesus was well-schooled in the Scriptures, and he often followed the traditions of his heritage. He also had a daily routine of prayer and service to the needs of other people. However, he didn't allow traditions or personal preferences to stand in the way of carrying out God's will for the day.

Look for God-given opportunities to serve God by serving others. Don't allow your daily routines, personal biases, or short sightedness cause you to miss what the Lord wants to do in you and through you today.

This is a concern for every follower of Jesus Christ, not only as individuals but also as a community of faith within the church. *It is a continual challenge to remain open to the call and guidance of the Holy Spirit.* But in doing so, a believer is remaining open to receive all the wonderful gifts that come from the life-giving presence of the resurrected and living Lord.

As a congregation, we also must remain open to whatever possibilities for ministry the Lord seeks to lead us into. Prayer and a willingness to work together in faith and love are important elements for a congregation to remain open and alert. It is vital that we always look for ways to build up and strengthen the body of Christ within the congregation.

The Apostle Paul, so many years ago, wrote encouraging words to the Thessalonian church that are still important for us to consider in our daily journey of faith. Paul said, "To this end we always pray for you, asking that our God will make you worthy of his call and will fulfill by his power every good resolve and work of faith, so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ." (2 Thess. 1:11)

When we make it our aim to glorify the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, we will discover that in whatever way the Lord leads us, even when difficult, it will be the way to life and blessing.

STEWARDSHIP MESSAGE: DUTY AND DELIGHT

Dr. Mark Allen Powell, professor of New Testament at Trinity Lutheran Seminary, Columbus, Ohio, suggests there are two important aspects to our faithful response as followers of Jesus Christ. In an article in The Lutheran magazine, he used this story to illustrate his concept of "Duty and Delight."

A Pentecostal pastor told me this story about giving.

"When I was 8 years old, I lived in a small town and one day my mother sent me to the florist to buy flowers for the family table. I remember being embarrassed as I walked home with the flowers, worried that my friends might see me and make fun of me for carrying flowers. But I did it, because I was an obedient son – it was my duty.

"Ten years later, I was in love with a young woman who lived in that town. I went to the same florist, bought her flowers and walked some of the same streets toward her house. But now I wasn't thinking about what anyone might think if they saw me. I was only thinking of two things: how happy she would be to get flowers, and how fortunate I was to be the one bringing them to her.

"That is the difference between doing something out of duty – and doing it out of delight."

I think about this story every time the offering plates come around in church. It's my duty to give money to support my congregation – and sometimes I do that just because it's the right thing to do. But other times, I'm eager to give my offering; how pleased God is to receive whatever we offer, and how fortunate we are to be people who know God and love God and who can give to God out of sheer delight.

MESSAGE FROM THE DAUGHTER PROJECT, MAY'S MINISTRY

Thank you for your ongoing prayer and financial support. The ten girls we have helped and the three girls presently in our home desperately need to know they are truly loved, and that is exactly what you are doing-- telling and showing them they are loved.

Without giving too many specific details, please pray for peace for our daughters; Amy, Jasmine and Tracy as well as our House Moms; Audrey, Emily, Liz and Megan. Amy is struggling, especially emotionally, and has great difficulty managing her interactions with the House Moms. Tracy has difficulty with her school work but mostly due to lack of motivation. Understandably, at 14 years of age, it is hard for her to see the value of school work when she has suffered so much physical and sexual abuse. Jasmine recently turned 18 and will need to leave our home as soon as she graduates in June per state of Ohio law. We are only licensed to care for girls between the ages of 10 and 17. Please pray that as she returns home, her parents will provide a safe and loving environment for her to continue healing. We fully expect this to happen as we have met often with her mom and dad

Also, each girl has the added difficulty of dealing with the law enforcement portion of the crimes committed against them. Some of their perpetrators have been caught and are facing charges but in order for them to be prosecuted, our girls need to re-live their abuse via legal testimony. Please pray for peace and wisdom for the girls as they work through this additional part of their recovery.

God alone can heal us completely. God alone can heal our daughters. Let us all pray and trust Him to do this for His glory and for the sake of these beautiful young ladies He created and brought to us.

COUNCIL MINUTES - APRIL 21, 2015

President Keith Mullen called the meeting to order. Pastor Rayl opened with devotions. Roll call was taken

A motion was made to accept the minutes from the March meeting by John Spoerl, seconded by Pam Beavers, motion carried.

Director of Faith Development / Sunday School: Jamie Blazevich thanked Dick and Bob Haar for transporting all 638 canned goods we collected during Souper Bowl of Caring to Lutheran Social Services.

This year, we had a Traveling Resurrection Story in place of our Easter Egg Hunt for JAM and the Dayschool during the Sunday School hour on March 29th. Thanks to all who donated their time and effort to fill the bags and/or help with the traveling story.

On April 19th, the 8th graders gave their "faith testimonies" and answered questions from the elders and had their celebratory brunch. Thank you to all who volunteered to be a part of this day. Confirmation is April 26th.

On May 3rd, we will have a VBS preview in JAM, and on May 10th we will have Pastries for Parents where we thank the JAM parents for their dedication for bringing their children to Sunday School. This will be our last day for JAM until fall.

Jamie announced she will be going to a women's retreat this Friday at the Seagate Center.

VBS will be Monday, June 22 through Thursday, June 25. The VBS theme is: Everest – Embark on an icy expedition where kids overcome obstacles with God's awesome power. Anchor kids in rock-solid Bible truths that will guide them through life's challenges. We need LOTS of volunteers, so save the date and plan to join us.

Elders: Finished reviewing candidates for the Winslow Scholarship. Recipients will be notified at their school scholarship ceremony. Also noted that there is a wedding on May 15th and May 23rd. The summer schedule also is in place.

Property Management: A new drinking fountain was installed on the first floor of the Educational Bldg. The vestibule & church heating problem was resolved (new thermostat and three additional relays replaced). Andy Hodges rebuilt 4 of 14 mid-range sub woofers. Jim Sommers negotiated down the Campbell bill for recent work.

Yet to do: Grading and seeding east of the Educational Bldg. Electrical overload on west wall of common offices to be addressed. Epoxy coating at the church entrance to be discussed for cure. The downspouts are plugged again; they were cleaned out when trees were trimmed. Closing cylinders on two doors need attention-- right rear door of Ed. Bldg. and front secondary door of the church. L.E.D. security lights to be replaced behind the church within the next week.

New items on the list: A pew is broken, a new brace needs to be added. (Pew to be repaired on Wednesday.) Screen damaged in church building needs replaced. Additional shingle loss noted on roof. Nordmann has been directed to repair to extend the life of the existing shingles and to measure for budget number to replace. The roof is in very poor condition. The water will be turned on in the cemetery in the coming weeks. Strip lighting at the pulpit is to be repaired. Fans will be double checked before heat arrives.

Finance Committee: We had a good month in March, but we still have a shortfall from the harsh winter. Motion to accept the Finance Committee / Treasurer's report made by Mike Winslow, seconded by Larry Paul, motion carried.

Dayschool Report: Bill Caldwell from the Dayschool Board reported they are working on next year's registration and are looking at the summer program.

Pastor's Report: Confirmation will be Sunday, April 26th. Our confirmands this year are: Tori Gallaher, Ryan Juhasz, Noah Koch, Taylor Layman, and Ashley Vartorella.

Old Business: Sound system—a motion was made by LuAnn Spoerl and seconded by Mike Winslow to upgrade the sound system and wiring (which is in very poor condition), spending up to \$18,000. The money will come from the Memorial Fund and other Improvement Funds. This action will go before the congregation for approval.

In an effort to grow the church's investments, a motion was made by Chris Hunsaker and seconded by Bill Nelson to invest \$100,000 from the Special Funds with the ELCA's Mutual Fund Investment. Motion carried.

New Business: None reported.

A special thank you to Lynn Folk—Lynn has served as Church Council Secretary for several years and has decided that with work and family she no longer has the time to serve. Thank you, Lynn, for all your years of hard work.

A motion to adjourn was made by Mike Winslow, seconded by Dave Wilbarger. Motion carried.
