PERSONAL NEEDS PANTRY: Good news! We will reopen the Personal Needs Pantry beginning September 2nd. It will look different as we follow Covid 19 guidelines, but we feel we have a safe plan for all involved. However, we need one person who can assist a veteran volunteer in the pantry. No training is necessary as the veteran volunteer will explain everything. Hours are Wednesdays from 9:00 to 11:30 am, but keep in mind you do **not** work every Wednesday, only every *sixth* Wednesday. If you volunteer to finish out this year, you will only work three Wednesdays. It's a very satisfying and undemanding ministry, as far as how much time is required of you. This volunteer would begin on September 2nd. Due to the new guidelines you must be physically able to carry products up the church basement steps and out to the clients' cars. PANTRY ITEMS NEEDED: To help refurbish our inventory, we especially need toilet paper, paper towels, and body soap (bars only, please). DAY SCHOOL STARTS THIS WEEK: Many area school districts have decided to use a hybrid format (both in class and online learning) when students return in the fall. Although this was implemented in the best interest of the students' health, it also causes problems for working parents. In response to this, our school will offer a program for school age students (K-3). Our program runs from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm each day with the option to add additional hours. We will provide a space for students to complete their online studies. There will also be Christian-based activities provided when the students finish their work. A tutor will be available, but the computers, curriculum and school work will be provided the child's classroom teacher. A morning snack, lunch and afternoon snack also will be provided. The cost is \$35 per day per child, with any additional time at \$4.50 per hour. There also is a \$50 registration fee. The CDC and Ohio Department of Education only allows a ratio of one teacher to nine students, so space will be limited. Each class will be separated into their own groups and will not interact with other classrooms. We also will follow all new CDC cleaning protocols and frequent hand washing schedules.
