

Welcome to First St. John Lutheran Church! Please review some of our reopening guidelines below.

Masks must be worn. We have some available to take if you don't have one. Some are cloth masks and can be taken home to wash and reuse. There are also disposable masks.

Please do not congregate in the Narthex (entrance area) either as you arrive or leave.

To minimize direct contact, we will use the outside aisles only for entry and exit. The center aisle will be used for communion, special needs, or emergency exit.

Ushers will fill the pews from the front to the back of the church and dismiss from the back to the front. Please follow their directions. We are sorry everyone cannot have their usual seat.

Due to increased cases of Covid in Lucas County, we are returning to no corporate singing or spoken responses. Dr. Tony and Annette Slater will provide music. The service will be recorded and published to the website. Future plans are to "live stream" the service.

Elders will wear gloves. You can get a bulletin at the check-in table when you walk in. Please <u>do not leave your bulletin in the pew</u> when you exit; take it home or put it in the recycling bin at the front door.

There is a small wooden church just to the right of the main door when you come in. It has a slot for your offering.

<u>Restrooms</u> are in the church basement. Go to the Narthex (lobby) and take the left set of steps down. The ladies room is at one end of the hallway, and the men's room is at the other. Return to the Narthex using the opposite set of stairs. Please, one person only in the restroom area.

<u>Diaper Changing</u>: A diaper changing table is available in the ladies restroom in the basement of the church.

<u>Flowers</u>: If you would like to sign up for flowers for a Sunday, please call the church office during the week to check on availability.

Invocation

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity (+) one God, the Lord of Israel who comes to set us free, the mighty Savior who comes to show mercy, the Dawn from on high who guides us into peace. Amen.

P: Let us come before God in confession.

(silence is kept for personal reflection)

- P: To you, O God, we lift up our souls. You know us through and through; we confess our sins to you. Remember not our sins; remember us with your steadfast love. Show us your ways; teach us your paths; and lead us in justice and truth, for the sake of your goodness in Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.
- P: Children of God, come with joy and draw water from the well of salvation. Remember the gift of baptism: your sin is washed away in the name of (+) Jesus; you belong to Christ; you are anointed to serve. Stand up and raise your heads! The reign of God is near.

Lighting the Fourth Candle

- P: Blessed are you, God of hosts, for you promised to send a son, Emmanuel, who brought your presence among us; and you promise through your Son Jesus to save us from our sin.
- P: As we light these candles, turn again to us in mercy; strengthen our faith in the word spoken by your prophets; restore us and give us life that we may be saved.
- P: O house of David, come. Let us rejoice, for the Son of God, Emmanuel, comes to be with us. Amen.

Announcements

FIRST READING: 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16

Instead of David building a house (temple) for the Lord, the Lord promises to establish David's house (dynasty) forever. Centuries later, after the Babylonian exile, no king sat on the throne. Even then, however, the people of Israel remembered this promise and continued to hope for a king, the messiah, the Lord's anointed.

Now when David the king was settled in his house, and the LORD had given him rest from all his enemies around him, ²the king said to the prophet Nathan, "See now, I am living in a house of cedar, but the ark of God stays in a tent." ³Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that you have in mind; for the LORD is with you."

⁴But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan: ⁵Go and tell my servant David: Thus says the LORD: Are you the one to build me a house to live in? ⁶I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I have been moving about in a tent and a tabernacle. ⁷Wherever I have moved about among all the people of Israel, did I ever speak a word with any of the tribal leaders of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" ⁸Now therefore thus you shall say to my servant David: Thus says the LORD of hosts: I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep to be prince over my people Israel; ⁹and I have been with you wherever you went, and have cut off all your enemies from before you;

and I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. ¹⁰And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may live in their own place, and be disturbed no more; and evildoers shall afflict them no more, as formerly, ¹¹from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel; and I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. ¹⁶Your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me; your throne shall be established forever.

Reader: Word of God. Word of Life. Thanks be to God.

Gospel Acciamation (please stand) (sung by Annette Slater)

Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed, Where a mother laid her baby in a manger for his bed: Mary was that mother mild, Jesus Christ, her little child.

And our eyes at last shall see him, through his own redeeming love; For that child so dear and gentle is our Lord in heav'n above; And he leads his children on to the place where he is gone.

Gospel Announcement

P: The Gospel according to St. Luke, Chapter 1. Glory to you, O Lord.

GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-38

In this annunciation, Luke makes clear that God comes with good news for ordinary people (Mary) from little-known places (Nazareth). This king will not be born to royalty in a palace, but to common folk in a stall. Here Luke highlights the role of the Spirit, a special emphasis in his gospel.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God.

³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Faith and Trust

In a sermon from 1527, Martin Luther referred to today's reading from Luke as a "happy and charming gospel." Indeed, the prelude to the events of this coming Christmas season all find their fulfillment in the annunciation to Mary by the angel Gabriel that she will bear a son and name him Jesus.

Today's gospel story has been the subject of many a renowned painter, sculptor, stained glass artist, poet, and composer. This story has spiritually moved generations of Christians who have wondered at Mary's faith, obedience, and readiness to be the chosen vessel of God in the mystery of the incarnation. Mary's permanence in the communion of saints remains. She is a model of faith and a woman whose example inspires us for all times.

Very soon Christmas will be here, and we will celebrate the truth of this biblical narrative. In the joyful observance of our Savior's birth we will not forget our faith and trust in the word and promise of God to us. This faith is rooted in the gospel story of the annunciation itself. Mary's faith and trust allowed her to welcome the angel's announcement, strange though it was. She could not understand at first how and why God had chosen her. The conception that was to take place was beyond her senses. Only God's gift of grace enabled Mary to believe and to offer herself willingly to God's service.

Mary's gift of faith and obedience was not hers alone. We, too, trust in the word announced to us. This gift of wonder and this sense of a holy task before us are available to all who humble themselves before the manger of Jesus Christ. This "happy and charming gospel" is ours forever.
