TIME TO ORDER EASTER FLOWERS: We have a VERY quick turnaround this year on ordering flowers to decorate the altar at Easter. The deadline for order flowers is March 3rd. The form is in the bulletin. You can mail in your flower order or drop it off in the little wooden church with your offering when you come for in-person worship.

ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENTEN SERVICES: Beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 17th, worship services will be at 11:00 am and 7:00 pm each Wednesday in Lent, which ends on March 24th. All current restrictions and safety protocols for COVID will be observed. Both Ash Wednesday services will be livestreamed, and each Wednesday's 11:00 am Lenten service will be livestreamed, recorded, and posted on the church's website.

MESSAGE FROM PASTOR: Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and sets the tone of the season. It is a pointed call to repentance, which is to say that it is a return to the death and resurrection in which we participate through Holy Baptism by way of confession and faith in the forgiveness of sins. As the Apostle Paul establishes: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3 & 4).

Thus the imposition of ashes, from which the day receives its name, recalls both the mortality of sinful humanity and the redemption of Christ, into which Jesus' followers have been baptized. This context of contrition and repentance, fully and firmly centered in the cross and resurrection of Christ Jesus, is the framework within which the Lenten fast is undertaken. A focus on Christ's Passion will not be chiefly an emotional or intellectual exercise, though the Word and Spirit of God engage both the intellect and the emotions. Rather, in faith the Passion is approached as the very heart of the Gospel, which the Lord our Savior has accomplished for us and now bestows on us with the Means of Grace.

Our current situation due to COVID-19 makes it extremely difficult to conduct our worship events in the ways we wish and are used to doing. There are many things that we are required to forego. Whether or not we can proceed with the Imposition of Ashes on Ash Wednesday is still in question. However, every possible consideration will be used to do this if at all possible, but the final decision may not be made until the day prior. All precautions will be taken and the service will still be meaningful no matter if it is done or not.

ONLINE BIBLE STUDY SCHEDULE: This week we will switch our online study Thursdays at 11:30 am (February 18th, 25th, etc.) so as not to conflict with the Wednesday Lenten services. Please note the study will be recorded and posted on the church's website at www.firststjohn.com
