LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE – TEXAS: In Texas, the lack of infrastructure to handle freezing temperatures and record-setting snow and ice led to power, food and water shortages. At its peak, 4.5 million homes and businesses were without electricity and heat. Around 13 million are also facing water disruptions due to bursting pipes and damaged water systems. As temperatures rise, melting ice and snow is expected to cause even more damage. Lutheran Disaster Response is supporting the Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast Synod, the Southwestern Texas Synod, the Northern Texas-Northern Louisiana Synod, and Lutheran Social Services Disaster Response. Relief efforts such as supplying water, food and generators to those in need and opening shelters are in place. Long-term recovery may include repairing water-damaged homes, disaster case management and supporting vulnerable populations. Gifts to "U.S. Severe Storms" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected.
