**HELP FOR COVID-RELATED FUNERAL EXPENSES**: Under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021, FEMA will provide financial assistance for Covid-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020. To be eligible, you must meet these conditions:

- 1) The death must have occurred in the United States
- 2) Death certificate must indicate death was attributed to Covid-19
- 3) Applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020
- 4) The deceased need not have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien.

Types of information you need include:

- 1) An official death certificate that attributes the death directly or indirectly to Covid-19 and shows the death occurred in the United States (including the territories and District of Columbia)
- 2) Funeral expense documents such as receipts, funeral home contract, etc., including the applicant's name, deceased person's name, amount of funeral expenses, and dates funeral expenses were incurred
- 3) Proof of funds received from other sources that were used for funeral costs. NOTE: FEMA is not able to duplicate benefits received from burial or funeral insurance, financial assistance received from voluntary agencies, government agencies, or other sources.
