The 1900's

After Pastor Carl Beckel's death in February of 1894, the parish called Pastor Gideon Rausch, who served until the spring of 1900. Then the congregation called Pastor W. Wacke who served for 29 years until June, 1929. During his tenure, the parish bought a piece of land and enlarged the church yard.

By early 1928 the second church was 60 years old and again became too small. In the spring of 1928 construction of a new church began, and on June 10th they laid the cornerstone. On November 4, 1928 the new (existing) church was consecrated, and it serves its members even today. The church



and organ cost approximately \$84,000--an amazing achievement for its members who were about to face the Great Depression in 1929 and World War II in 1939. From 1929 through 1945 the church struggled just to meet expenses.

Pastors

On June 23, 1929 Pastor William Wacke retired at age 75 after having served for 29 years. Pastor C. A. Wiederanders was called and served until 1947. In 86 years the church had only three pastors—a testament to the dedication of its clergy.

The tradition continues. Over the last 74 years only five senior pastors have served First St. John: Gerd Heidmann, Earl Willer, Harold Buenting, Robert Blohm, and Jerald Rayl (current). During their tenure, the church also had eight associate pastors: Kurt Heidmann, Robert Menter, Ronald Staber, John Underdahl, Philip Jordan, Gerald Webster, Jim Wicker, and Sharon Stonerock.

Today



One hundred and sixty years later, First St John Lutheran Church continues to serve. Pastor Jerald Rayl leads Sunday services at 8:00 and 10:30 AM. Sunday School classes for children through adults are held at 9:15 AM. Our Day School, run by Director Andrea Buckley, has 105 students.

We now look toward the future in prayer and thanks to God.

<u>Adult Sunday School</u> meets at 9:15 am in the lounge (middle floor of the educational building – turn right out of the door by the choir loft).

<u>Children ages 3 through 5th grade</u> will meet for Sunday School in the basement of the church (the JAM Room!) at 9:15 am.

<u>Catechism Class</u>: Class will be held from 9:15 to 10:15 am each Sunday.

<u>Nursery</u> is in the church basement and is currently unstaffed; you are welcome to sit with your child. A diaper changing table is available in the ladies restroom in the basement of the church.

<u>Restrooms</u> are in the church basement. Go to the Narthex (lobby) and take either set of steps to the basement hallway. The ladies room is at one end, and the men's room is at the other.

<u>Flowers</u>: If you would like to sign up for altar flowers, there is a book in the Narthex (lobby) under the main bulletin board. Or, you can call the church office during the week to check on availability.

<u>Memorials</u>: If you wish to give a memorial in honor or memory of a loved one, there are memorial cards in a stand near the bulletins. Or, you may mail one in or pick up a card in the church office and place it in the offering plate.

A Brief History of First St. John

In the late 1850's, the Rev. Johannes Doerfler, pastor of Salem Lutheran Church on Huron Street in Toledo, began mission work among the few scattered Lutherans settled in Oregon Township.

Not a single road existed east of the Maumee River beyond Front and Main Streets. To reach these Lutherans, Pastor Doerfler followed trails through woods and marshes. Services were first held in a log cabin on the corner of Consaul and Otter Creek Roads. Later when more space was needed, services were conducted on Jerusalem Road (now State Route 2) in Mr. Frederick Clausing's barn.

The Church is Established

In 1861, Pastor Doerfler established First St. John Lutheran Church. Eight charter members organized the congregation: John Frederick Clausing, John F. W. Bitter, John Christoph Ackerman, Leonhard Schmidt, Frederick Koehne, John Dietrich Koehne, Henry Koehne, and Henry Tiedjen. A 21 x 31 foot church was built just east of the Orphans Home on Seaman Street.



First and Second Church Building

In 1862, a year after its organization, the little flock called its first local pastor, Rev. Carl Beckel. Under his leadership the congregation was incorporated under the laws of Ohio on June 22, 1863. The church grew, and by 1868 another 12 feet were added to the building. By 1876, the church had grown so much that a new 40 x 60 foot church was built for \$3,500. A balcony was added in 1885 to increase capacity.

After a highly successful pastorate of 31 years, St. John's lost its faithful pastor in February of 1894.

German Heritage

While the German language predominated among the Lutheran settlers, it was also the official language of the congregation. English Sunday School and church services were introduced in 1910. Regular weekly English services, were added in 1915, but the English language did not predominate until World War I in 1917. The German language was dropped entirely from the Sunday School in 1919, and German church services were discontinued in 1934.



SECOND READING: 1 Peter 2:4-10
