<u>Adult Sunday School</u> meets at 9:15 am in the lounge (middle floor of the educational building – turn right out of the door by the choir loft).

<u>Children ages 3 through 5th grade</u> will meet for Sunday School in the basement of the church (the JAM Room!).

<u>Catechism Class</u>: Class will be held from 9:15 to 10:15 am each Sunday.

<u>Nursery</u> is in the church basement and is currently unstaffed; you are welcome to sit with your child. A diaper changing table is available in the ladies restroom in the basement of the church.

<u>Restrooms</u> are in the church basement. Go to the Narthex (lobby) and take either set of steps to the basement hallway. The ladies room is at one end, and the men's room is at the other.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 25:6-9

This reading focuses on the future day when the Lord will manifest sovereignty over the universe. On that day, the Lord will host a banquet for God's faithful subjects, symbolizing the Lord's dominion established on earth and the joy, companionship, and prosperity that will characterize the Lord's reign.

On this mountain the LORD of hosts will make for all peoples

I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. ²And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. ³And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying,

"See, the home of God is among mortals.

He will dwell with them as their God: they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them;

⁴he will wipe every tear from their eyes.

Death will be no more;

mourning and crying and pain will be no more.

for the first things have passed away."

By raising Lazarus, Jesus offers the world a vision of the life to come when death and weeping will be no more.

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY

Sing Through the Tears

Most of us here have lost a loved one--a grandparent, parent, child, sibling, spouse, colleague, or friend. The sting of death is sharp and our whole world seems to change as we face deep grief and loss.

All three readings today include the image of tears. The death of Lazarus brings profound grief to Mary, Martha, and Jesus. Their weeping reveals the depth of their love for Lazarus, and the anguish of their loss. The readings from Isaiah and Revelation give a vision of a day when there will be no more mourning, crying and pain, for God will comfort us and wipe away the tears from our faces.

Sometimes we say that people in the midst of deep grief are "doing well" when they are holding together and not breaking down with tears or emotion. So often we in our society cover over our feelings, and try to sanitize death. In contrast, some people experience or remember the custom of actually placing dirt on the coffin at the gravesite, a custom that helps make death real. Perhaps the finality of the ritual and the accompanying tears are a healthy part of the grieving and letting go.

As we celebrate the eucharist, the saints of God are present with us in a "holy communion." Our meal is a foretaste of the great feast on the mountain promised by the prophet Isaiah. Even amid life's losses, the home of God is made with us and in us.

We sing with all the people of God of the great feast of victory, the resurrection of Christ in which death, sin, and evil are destroyed and life is made new. We sing through our tears, knowing we are one with the saints of all ages, and that nothing can separate us from the promise God makes to us in holy baptism and will bring to completion at our own death.
