

Offering: There is a small wooden church just to the right of the main door when you come in. It has a slot for your offering.

<u>Adult Sunday School</u> meets at 9:15 am in the lounge (middle floor of the educational building – turn right out of the door by the choir loft).

<u>Children ages 3 through 5th grade</u> will meet for Sunday School in the basement of the church (the JAM Room!).

<u>Catechism Class</u>: Class will be held from 9:15 to 10:15 am each Sunday.

<u>Nursery</u> is in the church basement and is currently unstaffed; you are welcome to sit with your child. A diaper changing table is available in the ladies restroom in the basement of the church.

<u>Restrooms</u> are in the church basement. Go to the Narthex (lobby) and take either set of steps to the basement hallway. The ladies room is at one end, and the men's room is at the other.

<u>Flowers</u>: If you would like to sign up for altar flowers, there is a book in the Narthex (lobby) by the telephone. Or, you can call the church office during the week to check on availability.

Memorials: If you wish to give a memorial in honor or memory of a loved one, you may mail it in or pick up a memorial card in the church office or in the Narthex (lobby) and place it in the offering plate.

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 31:7-14

Like the prophets who announce homecoming and salvation in the book of Isaiah, Jeremiah announces the wondrous homecoming of God's people from exile. Once again the Lord enters human history to fulfill the promise made during the exodus from Egypt so long ago: "I will be your God, and you will be my people."

Thus says the LORD:

Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob,

and raise shouts for the chief of the nations;

proclaim, give praise, and say,

"Save, O LORD, your people,

the remnant of Israel."

⁸See, I am going to bring them from the land of the north, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth,

among them the blind and the lame, those with child and

those in labor, together;

a great company, they shall return here.

⁹With weeping they shall come,

and with consolations I will lead them back,

I will let them walk by brooks of water,

in a straight path in which they shall not stumble;

for I have become a father to Israel,

and Ephraim is my firstborn.

¹⁰Hear the word of the LORD, O nations,

and declare it in the coastlands far away;

say, "He who scattered Israel will gather him,

and will keep him as a shepherd a flock."

¹¹For the LORD has ransomed Jacob,

and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him.

¹²They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion,

and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the Lord,

their life shall become like a watered garden,

and they shall never languish again.

¹³Then shall the young women rejoice in the dance,

SECOND READING: Ephesians 1:3-14

The letter to the Ephesians concerns God's plans and purpose for the world. It begins with a prayer thanking God for the blessings that already belong to us in Christ and for the yet more glorious future that awaits.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, ⁴just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. ⁵He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, ⁶to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. ⁷In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸that he lavished on us.

With all wisdom and insight ⁹he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, ¹⁰as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. ¹¹In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, ¹²so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. ¹³In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; ¹⁴this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

Gospel Acclamation

GOSPEL: John 1:1-18

John's gospel presents Jesus as the full embodiment of God's grace and truth, the one who reveals God's love for the whole creation.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. ⁸He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. ⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

¹⁰He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. ¹⁵(John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' ")

¹⁶From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

Embodied Love

The mystery is so immense as to be almost incomprehensible. That the very Word of God, present at creation when God's Spirit moved over the waters, should take on human skin and share our life, is a wonder we grasp only by faith.

That incarnate Word, whom we know as Jesus Christ, is both messenger and message. Jesus, the bearer of light to an uncomprehending people, is himself the very Light of the world. Jesus, the Word, is God's gracious word to us. It is a curious fusion, this unity of person and mission, life and teaching.

This fusion continues today in our own embodiment of Jesus' example and teaching. Through us, Jesus is not simply a concept, but real, tangible. We "live" Jesus. How? By speaking a word of encouragement to one verging on despair. By serving those whose circumstances cause them to doubt the presence or goodness of God. By modeling the love of Christ in our families, churches, and communities. By calling for an end to practices that unjustly benefit a few at the expense of many. By experiencing in suffering the redeeming presence of the God who suffers with us. By gathering weekly with other Christians to hear the word proclaimed, preached, and sung. By sharing the holy meal in which we not only receive Jesus in bread and wine, but become the very body we receive: the body of Christ.

Our witness to the Jesus who lived and suffered like us is only possible because, like Jesus, we are kept close to God's heart. We can make Christ known only because Jesus blazed the way by showing us what God is like. In this season when we celebrate the incarnation, we rejoice that Jesus reveals the very heart of God, so that we, too, might live in that love and bear it in our very bodies to all creation.
