

Transfiguration of Our Lord

Welcome to First St. John Lutheran Church! We offer two services with Sunday School for youth and adults and catechism between the services. Our regular Sunday schedule is:

<u>Livestream and Recorded Worship</u>: We livestream the service on our church website at www.firststjohn.com. Also, the service will be recorded and published to the website.

<u>Adult Sunday School</u> meets at 9:15 am in the lounge (middle floor of the educational building – turn right out of the door by the choir loft).

<u>Children ages 3 through 5th grade</u> will meet for Sunday School in the basement of the church (the JAM Room!).

<u>Catechism Class</u>: Class will be held from 9:15 to 10:15 am each Sunday.

<u>Nursery</u> is in the church basement and is currently unstaffed; you are welcome to sit with your child. A diaper changing table is available in the ladies restroom in the basement of the church.

<u>Restrooms</u> are in the church basement. Go to the Narthex (lobby) and take either set of steps to the basement hallway. The ladies room is at one end, and the men's room is at the other.

<u>Flowers</u>: If you would like to sign up for altar flowers, there is a book in the Narthex (lobby) by the telephone. Or, you can call the church office during the week to check on availability.

Memorials: If you wish to give a memorial in honor or memory of a loved one, you may mail it in or pick up a memorial card in the church office or the Narthex (lobby) and place it in the offering plate.

GOSPEL: Luke 9:28-36

Here is a remarkable conclusion to the Epiphany season. The transfiguration of Jesus is itself a great epiphany or manifestation. But in the midst of this event is talk of what will happen in Jerusalem, where Jesus must suffer and die.

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.

²⁹And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. ³¹They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. ³²Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. ³³Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"--not knowing what he said. ³⁴While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ³⁵Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" ³⁶When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

Light for All

What impression must the transfiguration have made on Peter, John, and James? Their familiar teacher, now clothed in incredible light, was standing with Moses and Elijah, the embodiment of the law and the prophets. Then that voice came from the cloud that enveloped them! Understandably, they were awed and terrified, and so kept silent about it for the time being. They couldn't fathom what this might mean, in part because they didn't yet have all the pieces. They knew Jesus the teacher and healer, but not Jesus the savior. In time, they would see him arrested, tried, crucified, and then raised to life again. Only after Jesus had ascended to heaven and the Spirit had come upon the disciples would they have the whole story. Only then would they be fully equipped to tell others about this redeemer who once was transfigured before their eyes.

Our eyes didn't see Jesus shining with heavenly light. Yet we have an advantage over those three disciples. We know the whole story. We have heard and read about Jesus' teachings, the life he lived, and of course, his death and resurrection. We know why he was sent: to forgive the sins of all people and to reunite us with God. After all these years, the story is familiar and comfortable, yet no less compelling.

This is too good to keep to ourselves. People need to know of this life- and light-bringing savior. There is no reason for us to wait before telling others. We know the whole story; we have already been empowered by the Holy Spirit. The time for us to be apostles--witnesses to the resurrection--is now. We are called to overcome our shyness, our fear of rejection, every obstacle, to bring this life-changing story to those who don't know it. Jesus taught us to go and tell. As the heavenly voice said, "Listen to him!"
