SOUPER BOWL OF CARING UPDATE: So far, between the money and the food donations we’ve collected, we have the equivalent of 865 food items donated. (For those who want to know the details, each dollar we collect translates into one food item that Lutheran Social Services can purchase for their pantry. We’ve collected 442 items and \$423.25 [that’s 423 items] so far.) We are a little more than halfway to our goal of 1,600 items, so keep up the good work!
