

All may make the sign of the cross, the sign that is marked at baptism.

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

P: In the waters of baptism, we have passed over from death to life with Jesus Christ, and we are a new creation.

C: For this saving mystery, and for this water, let us bless God, who was, who is, and who is to come.

(Water may be poured into the font as the presiding minister gives thanks.)

- P: We thank you, God, for your river of life, flowing freely from your throne: through the earth, through the city, through every living thing. You rescued Noah and his family from the flood; You opened wide the sea for the Israelites.
- C: Now in these waters you flood us with mercy, and our sin is drowned forever. You open the gate of righteousness, and we pass safely through.
- P: In Jesus Christ, you calm the troubled waters. You nourish us and enclose us in safety. You call us forth and send us out. In lush and barren places, you are with us.
- C: You have become our salvation.
- P: Now, creative Holy Spirit, as you did at the moment of creation, breathe upon this water and awaken your church once more. Claim us again as your beloved and holy people.
- C: Quench our thirst; cleanse our hearts; wipe away every tear.

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation; <sup>16</sup> for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers—all things have been created through him and for him. <sup>17</sup>He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. <sup>18</sup>He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. <sup>19</sup>For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, <sup>20</sup> and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

<sup>21</sup>And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, <sup>22</sup>he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him—<sup>23</sup>provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. 

## Listen!

Today we meet two sisters who were friends of Jesus. He was a guest at their home. As we come to worship today, Mary and Martha model two ways of being in the presence of the Lord.

Mary sat at the feet of Jesus as his student. She was so engrossed in what he was saying that she left her sister Martha to do all the work.

An important guest had come to their home. Showing proper hospitality would include providing water to wash the guests' feet, oil to cleanse their skin, food and drink to refresh them, and a comfortable space for all to relax and share conversation. Martha made these things happen. While Martha attended to these tasks, Mary simply sat at Jesus' feet and soaked in his grace-filled words. It made Martha a bit angry. Finally, she asked Jesus to tell Mary to get up and share in the work.

Like Martha, as we come to be in the presence of our Lord, we might be distracted by many things. It may be difficult to separate ourselves from all of the good things we have been or could be doing. It may be even more difficult to put aside worries or hurts that keep us from enjoying God's presence. We need to know that we are not imprisoned by our busy-ness or fears but set free to rest in the presence of the one who says, "You are a child of God." There is a time to get out of the kitchen, time to lay aside our anxieties, and just sit in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Many things are important; many are worthwhile. But Jesus reminds us there is need of only one thing, the grace of God given us by Christ. Like Mary, we can choose the better part, which will not be taken away from us.
