NEWS FROM LUTHERAN MINISTRIES OF MERCY ANNUAL MEETING: Two representatives from First St. John Lutheran Church attended the 10th annual Lutheran Ministries of Mercy (LMM) meeting on March 13th. LMM is a combination of Filling Memorial Home (64th annual meeting), Luther Home of Mercy (95th annual meeting) and the Lutheran Social Services of NW Ohio (112th annual meeting). Bishop Daniel Beaudoin's opening remarks and prayer focused on the theme: "MANY VOICES ONE STORY". Dinner was served before the business meeting. The meeting included an annual financial report and nominations for the LMM & LSS foundation boards. Guest speakers from each agency presented a short speech and video presentation of accomplishments during the past year. Some of the numbers presented were 281,865 meals served to food pantry clients, 3,475 volunteer hours, and 835 clients served in mental health and substance abuse programs. A final message was given by Bishop Chester Trail: "We hear the voices of those we serve, their families, our donors, and so many in our communities . . . as those voices come together, they tell the same story-- a story of love and caring, reminding us that we are not so different at all."

<u>DAY SCHOOL REGISTRATION HAS BEGUN</u>: Registration for the 2023-2024 fall Day School program has begun. The registration fee is waived for active members of the church, but you must still complete a registration form to reserve a spot for your child. The form can be found online at www.firststjohndayschool.org Children must be at least 3 years old and potty-trained. Our classes are from 9:00 am to noon, with extended care available from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. We also will have our Summer Child Care program for children ages 3-12 years old. The Day School will host summer camps each week with a different theme. Both children needing childcare and children looking for fun activities will be welcome.
