To frightened shepherds on the edge of town, an angel makes a startling announcement: To you is born a Savior. One who saves. Saves from what? In the gentle glow of our Christmas celebrations, we might pause for a moment to ponder this question. Jesus came to destroy the power of sin and death, to save us from our slavery to sin and from the spiritual death that accompanies separation from God.

To you is born a Savior. This announcement is made not just to the shepherds, but to all who hear these words in faith. This word is a plural "you."
